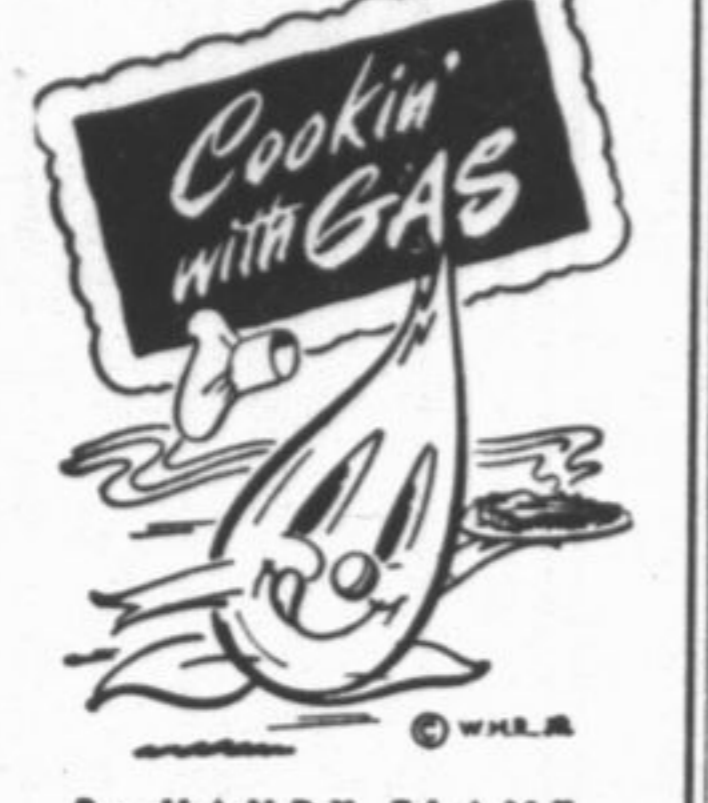
## LEGAL

### CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION

On Thursday, October 20th at 8:00 P. M. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, the Civil Service Commission of the City of Highland Park will hold an examination to establish an eligible list for assistant building inspector.
