Picchiotti-Cronkwhite Combination Leads To Frosh-Soph Victory

Highland Park high school's Frosh-Soph football team struck fast and scored in the first and second quarters to down a scrappy Waukegan team 13 to 7 in a Suburban Conference tilt last Saturday on the local gridiron.

Early in the first quarter the Blue and White rushed the Waukegan kicker to take over the ball on the Highland Park 35 yard stripe. They worked the ball down to the 20 yard marker where Signori skirted around end into pay dirt. The try for extra point failed and Highland Park led 6 to 0.

Cronkwhite Scores
The last Highland Park score came in the second quarter as Frank Picchiotti intercepted a pass on the Waukegan 40 yard line. A pass from Picchiotti to Cronkwhite was good for six points. Ori's kick was good for the extra point and at half time the Blue and White led 13 to 0.

As the third quarter started the Waukegan boys took the kick-off on their own 40 yard line and drove down the field to the 6 yard marker where the Highland Park boys dug in and held for downs.

However a Highland Park pass was intercepted on the 30 yard line from where Waukegan drove over the goal line for the score. They made the extra point on a pass to make the score 13 to 7 in favor of the Blue and White.

Both teams threatened in the final quarter. A pass from Picchiotti to Cronkwhite was good for 40 yards to the Waukegan 20 yard line. However the Blue and White attack bogged down. In the final minutes of the game Waukegan drove deep into Highland Park territory but a pass interception by Herz gave Highland Park control of the ball and the game.

Vicious Tackle
Joe Hoffman, playing his first game for Highland Park came up with one of the cleanest and most vicious tackles seen on the local field for many a year. It was this tackle that started the Blue and White rolling and gave them the fight they needed to win the game.

Coach Grover started Marovitz and Cronkwhite at ends; Baum and Klee at tackles; Herz and Pizzatto at guards and Antes at center. In the backfield were Hoffman, Frank Picchiotti, Zahnle and Turki.

The whole team played clean hard football and are looking forward to next Saturday when they take on New Trier on the local field.

Highland Park Crushed In Homecoming By Waukegan 42 to 0

Scoring in every quarter, Waukegan crushed a weak but game Highland Park eleven 42 to 0 last Saturday before a small "homecoming" crowd on the local field.

From the opening gun Waukegan on the move, they drilled all the way to the Little Giant's 10 yard line but lost the ball on a fumble. A few plays later a Highland Park punt was blocked and the Bulldogs had the ball on the Blue and White 20 yard stripe. On second down Mixan swept 14 yards to score.

Long Run Called Back
Midway in the first period Eddie Mixan grabbed a Blue and White punt on his 3 yard line and, with beautiful blocking, raced 97 yards to what seemed to be a sure touchdown, only to have it nullified by a holding penalty.

Waukegan scored their second touchdown of the day in the second quarter, when, after a long march, Gibbs drove over from the 2 yd marker. McKillen's boot for the extra point was good.

Before the half ended the Bulldogs added another tally, this one on a 38 yard pass play from Jadrick to Davis. McKillen booted his third straight point after touchdown to make the score 21 to 0 at half time.

Coleman Injured
In the second half, minus the services of the injured Don Coleman, Highland Park's Little Giants tried gamely to hold off Waukegan's vaunted attack, but to no avail. The Bulldogs battered the Highland Park line for three tallies, one in the third quarter on a 12 yard smash through the middle by Davis and two in the final quarter. Wilson tore through right tackle for the first and then he threw an 8 yard aerial to Ruckebell for the final score of the contest.

McKillen Boots Six Points
McKillen, star Waukegan place-kicker added the extra points for the three scores in the second half to make six straight extra points for the afternoon.

Aside from some fine line play by George "Bud" Glader and Jules Levy, and the work of backs, Lou Grimmeison and Paul Jones, the game had very few bright spots as far as Highland Park was concerned.

Next Saturday Coach Dave Floyd's Little Giants will take on the "Big Noise from Winnetka," the Green Wave of New Trier, in a game on our home field.

Highwood Merchants Whip Fort Sheridan By 20-6 Score

The newly organized Highwood Merchants football team smashed out a 20-6 win over the Fort Sheridan eleven in their 1949 debut at the Fort Sheridan field on Saturday and showed indications of being a fast scrappy club.

The victors piled up an early lead and led in every offensive department. Led by former Highland Park high school griddler, Bob Plummer, Highwood tallied twice in the second quarter and added another in the fourth period while the Army eleven tallied on a fumble in the waning minutes of the game.

Should Be Plummer Merchants
Plummer, who runs the team from the quarterback post, was all over the field both offensively and defensively as he scored two touchdowns and had three more touchdowns that were nullified by Highwood penalties.

Early in the second period, Plummer scooted 25 yards for a touchdown on a quarterback sneak, then smashed over from the one yard line in the second period for another six pointer. Whitey Schuer of Lake Forest added both Highwood extra points on running plays. It was Plummer again who figured in the final Highwood touchdown, as he passed to Junior Mahoney for a 20 yard scoring play. The extra point was missed on a boot by Capt. Jack Cahill.

Fort Sheridan scored their lone touchdown when a sixty yard screen pass put them on the Highwood twenty yard line. An attempted line play resulted in a fumble for the Army but Wilson, alert Fort Sheridan tackle, scooped up the ball and ran for a touchdown.

Boltwood A. C. To Play Highwood Merchants Tonight

The Highwood Merchant Football team will open their home season tonight (Thursday) at Memorial Field in Highwood when they meet the Boltwood A. C. eleven of Evanston with game time scheduled at 8 p.m.

Fresh from their opening triumph over the Fort Sheridan team, Highwood will be at full strength for the clash with the downshore rivals. The Evanston team was undefeated until this year having rung up 25 straight wins in three years since their inception. This year, as members of the newly formed Northwest Chicagoland football league, the Boltwood team has a season record of two wins, two losses and a tie.

Coach Frank Menduo's forces will have to be at top strength to beat the visitors, and with the Boltwood eleven, made up of former Evanston High school players, and the Highwood team, composed of former Highland Park and New Trier players, intense rivalry will prevail.

Menduo was especially pleased with the performance of Bob Plummer at quarterback. Plummer is a triple threat star who can run, kick and pass. A pair of New Trier halfbacks will give the visitors plenty of trouble in the persons of Joe Dempsey and Red Risdon, who have speed to burn. Chuck Schuer, former Lake Forest star, will see plenty of action for the locals along with "Crazy Legs" Carlson. The Highwood line boasts of such scrappers as Amy Minorini at center, Jack Cahill and Bob Fiore at tackles and Lou Fabbri, Mahoney, Cowgill and Jack Swarthout of Lake Forest will see action at the end positions.

The Highwood team will sport their new white uniforms before what promises to be a large opening night crowd.
