LEGAL

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND GOVERNING THE CONSTRUCTION, ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF DRIVEWAYS OVER UPON OR ACROSS PUBLIC SIDEWALKS OR PUBLIC PARKWAYS"

SECTION I. That an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating and Governing the Construction, Establishment and Maintenance of Driveways Over, Upon or Across Public Sidewalks or Public Parkways"

Section 1-a. Where any person, firm or corporation shall have heretofore constructed, built or existing driveway across, over or upon any portion of the public sidewalk or public parkway, whether constructed or maintained pursuant to permit previously obtained or otherwise, in that section of the City of Highland Park now or hereafter zoned "G—Outlying Business District" or "H—Central Business District" or "I—Industrial District" and where the premises adjacent to such driveway and served thereby shall be now or hereafter used and devoted to business, commercial or industrial uses or purposes, then such person, firm or corporation so owning or occupying the premises abutting upon said parkway and served by such driveway shall within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this ordinance construct or reconstruct such driveway or driveways as provided by and in conformity with the provision of the ordinance above described to which this ordinance is an amendment; except where any such driveway shall now be constructed in conformity with the provisions of that ordinance.

SECTION II. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION III. This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recordation and publication, as provided by law.

Funeral services will be held Friday morning (hour undecided) at the Seguin Funeral Home, with interment at Vernon cemetery, Half-day.

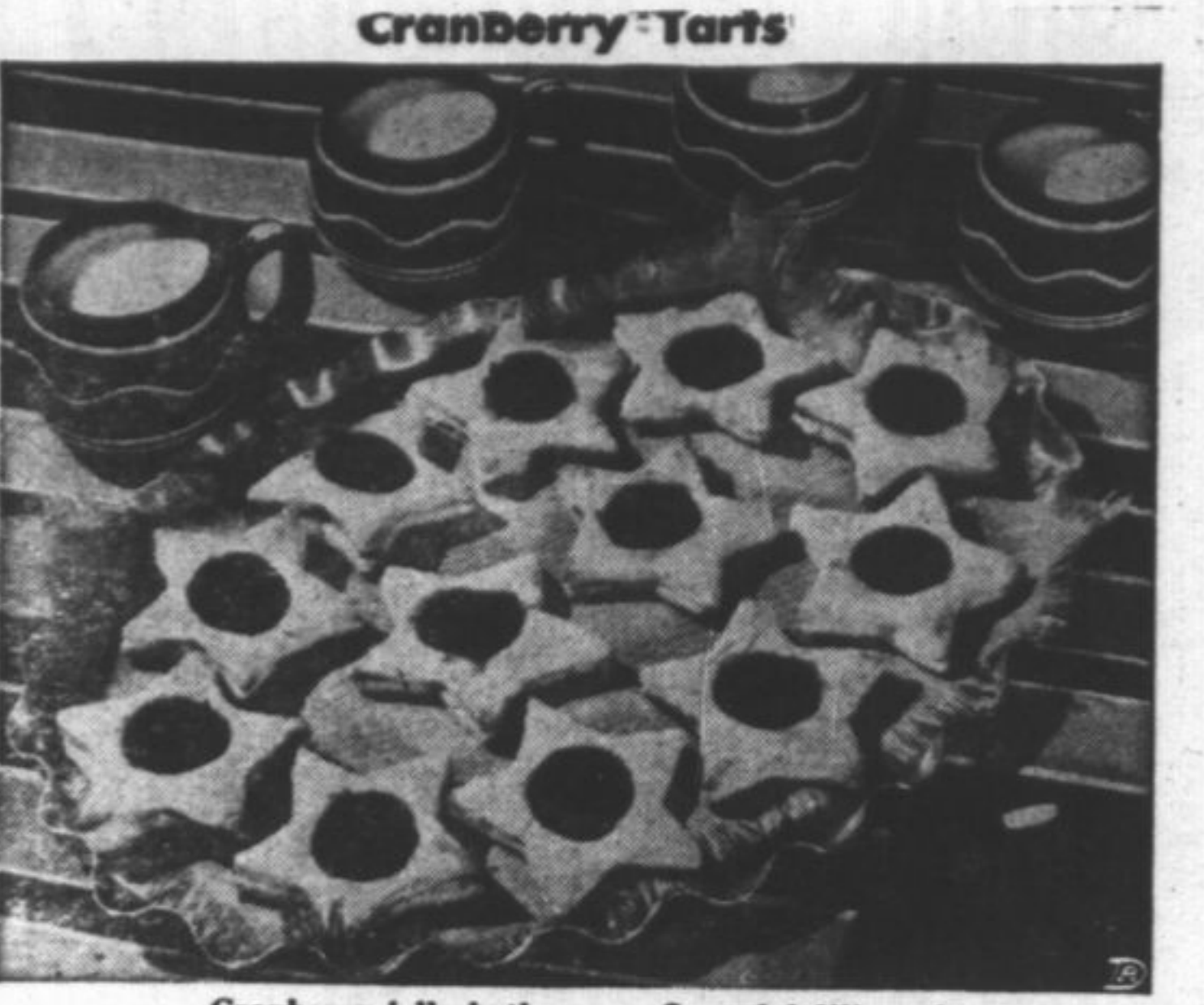
Vail

Cranberry Tarts Cranberry jelly is the easy, flavorful filling of these double-deck pastry tarts.

Look to your cookie cutters and other gadgets to make novel tarts from tender pastry. A star cookie cutter and a small round cutter (from biscuit cutter) were all that was needed to shape the star-bright pastries pictured here. Different fillings as well as different shapes may be used to vary an assortment of crisp tarts. Bright preserves and jellies, or mince-meat, are especially good. Odd pieces of pastry will be left after cutting the tarts. Pile the pieces in layers, about three or four to a layer, as this seems to keep pastry very flaky when it is rolled a second time. Sprinkle rolled-out pastry with a cinnamon and sugar mixture, then cut into individual pie-shaped pieces or squares, and bake. Cranberry star pastries make attractive refreshments for the holiday whirl as well as dessert tidbits for the family.

CRANBERRY TARTS 2 cups sifted enriched flour 1 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup shortening 5 to 5 tablespoons cold water 1 1/2 cups cranberry sauce Sift together flour and salt. Cut or rub in shortening. Add water. Mix to a dry crumbly dough. Toss on lightly floured pastry cloth. Press dough together. Roll out one-eighth inch thick. Cut with floured star-shaped cutter. Place half of stars on ungreased baking sheet. Put about one tablespoon cranberry sauce on each star. Cut small holes in remaining stars. Place on top of other stars. Seal edge together. Bake in hot oven (450 degrees F.) 12 to 15 minutes. Makes about 18 tarts.
