(a) The fee to be charged for a permit to construct, erect, enlarge, structure, building or part thereof shall be one dollar (\$1.00) plus total cost of the material and labor required for the proposed work, plus one-sixth of one per cent of the remainder of that estimated total cost. Such estimated cost shall be determined by the building inspector as follows: The building inspector may accept an estimate the permit, or he may require a certificate from a licensed architect or an affidavit from the owner or refreshments. his agent as to the total cost of the proposed work.
