You Can Have What You Want

In this Age of Anxiety, the second half of the unpredictable 20th Century, it's good for us to pause, brush away the cobwebs in our minds, restate our goals and re-affirm our faith in that Mighty Power which is in each of us.

Taking time out between the many New Years' social engagements, I read, and re-read, a highly interesting little book which has more uncommon common sense in it than any other book I've ever read.

The book is titled, "It Works". It's in its 17th printing; distributed by Scribner & Co. 6007 Barton Avenue, Los Angeles, Cal.; and can be read and inwardly digested in 30 short minutes. Cost? 50 cents.

"It Works" was written by a highly successful man who earnestly believes the greatest good comes from helping others without expecting praise. He has, therefore, omitted his name.

But his ideas, concrete as they can be, are worth a million dollars.

HIS PLAN OF ACCOMPLISHMENT . . .

Working under the established theological viewpoint that there definitely is in each of us a Mighty Power anxious to serve us, a Power able to give us that which we earnestly desire, the author writes that this power is "capable and willing to carry to a complete and perfect conclusion every earnest desire" of our objective mind providing we are sincere about what we want.

This goal, or goals, of ours can't be just wishes, the author states.

They must be deep and earnest desires.

THE SPECIFIC STEPS . . .

Here's his plan for positive, resultful living:

"Write down on paper in order of their importance the things and conditions you really want. Do not be afraid of wanting too much. Go the limit in writing down your wants.

"Change the list daily, adding to or taking from it, until you have it about right," he writes.

What you list should be specific.

For example, if you want a new car, list the make, style, color . . . and when you want it.

RULES TO FOLLOW . . .

Now, if you're in earnest about getting what you want:

1. Read the list three times each day—morning, noon, night.

2. As often as possible, think of what you want.

3. Keep your thoughts to yourself, discussing them with no one but that Great Power within you.

"There's no need to analyse how this Power within you is going to accomplish your desires," the writer warns.

Instead, have faith—the same kind you have when you know the sun will shine; the grass will grow; and summer will arrive.

Towards the end of his great book, the author cautions that some of the things you might earnestly want could bring unhappiness to others.

In brief, "plan that which you are sure will give to you and your fellow man the greatest good . . ."

LESSER FIRST; THEN HIGHER

Accomplish lesser things first. Later, seek the higher and really important objectives in life.

"One will be to help others as you have been helped. Great is the reward to those who help and give without thought of self, as it is impossible to be unselfish without gain," the author concludes.

Yes, you can remain as you are . . . or have anything you want.

It's strictly up to you.
