Highland Park Home**

A fire discovered at 5:30 a.m. on New Year's day entirely destroyed the inside of the two-story stucco home of the Kenneth H. Morines, 242 Prospect avenue. It is reported to have started from a burning cigarette butt on a davenport, climbing the walls to the attic before it was discovered.

Mr. Morine, midwest sales representative for a perfume manufacturing company, awoke early New Year's day to find the house filled with smoke. He seized his youngest child, Jean Ann, aged 4, shouting to his wife and other daughter, Mary Ann, 10, and ran down the stairs. The wife and older daughter were rescued from the roof, to which they escaped by way of a bedroom window, with the help of a fireman.

The Highland Park fire department fought the blaze, assisted by units from Glencoe and Highwood.

Two Highland Park firemen were injured—Lt. Charles Robinson, who was treated at the Highland Park hospital for a cut hand, and Paul Marty, who wrenched his knee when falling from a porch.

Living temporarily at the John Stevens home, 216 Prospect, the Morine family has been able to rent a home on 311 Woodland, during the three months the owners are staying in Florida.

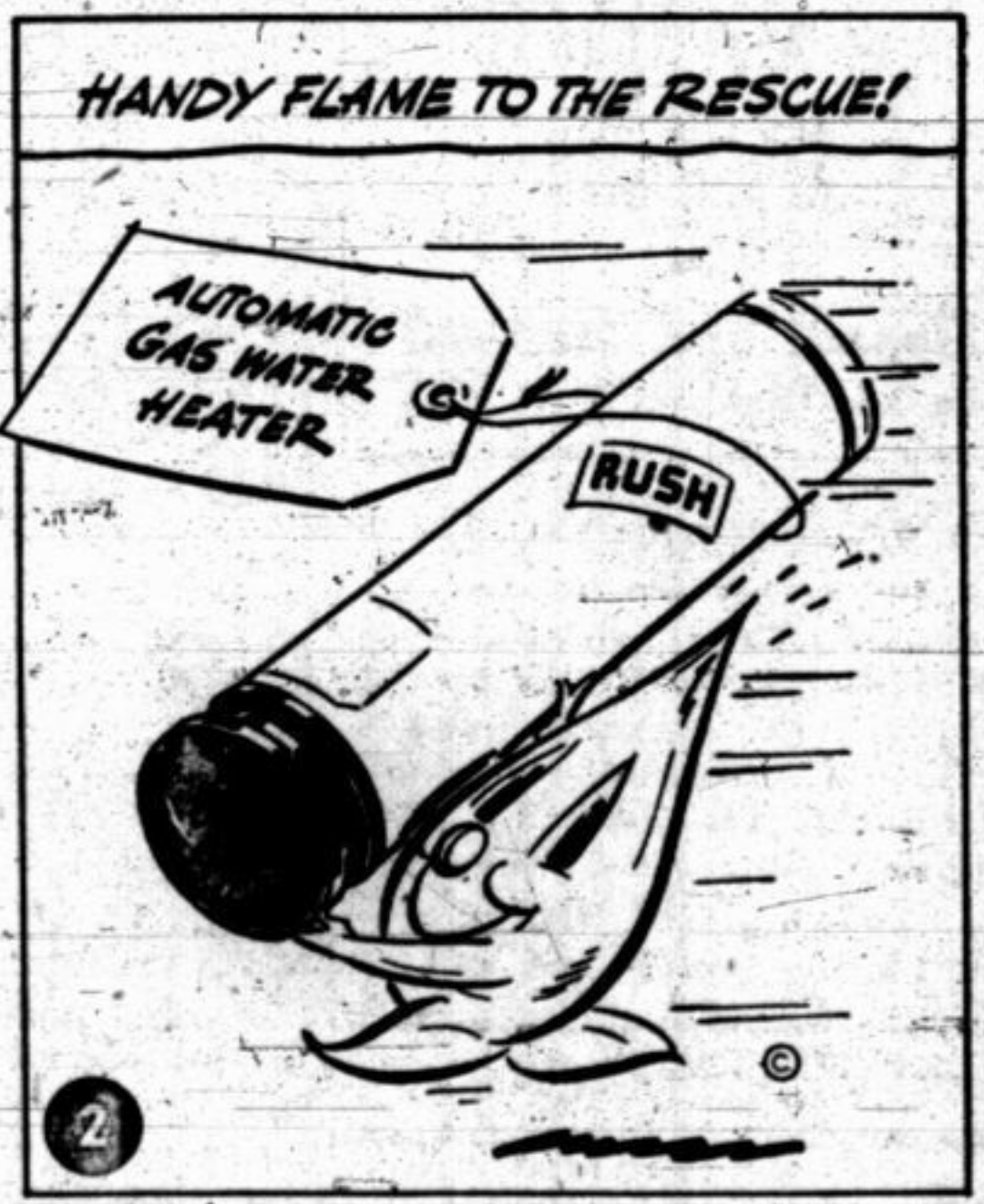
