LEGAL

ORDINANCE NO. 50-0-64 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGH-WOOD:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any street in the City of Highwood between the hours of 2:00 A.M. and 6:00 A. M. whenever snow is falling, or within forty-eight hours after it has snowed at any time during the day or night. Any person, firm or corporation who violates the provision of this ordinance shall be fined not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

Section 2. The employees of the Street Department and the Police Department are authorized to tow any vehicle off the street which is found in violation of this ordinance, or obtain assistance to accomplish that object, and the owner may not repossess his vehicle until he has paid the cost of towing, not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00).
