Chicago Symphony Orchestra At New Trier, March 15

The first concert played by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in any of the Chicago suburbs in more than twenty years will be presented at New Trier Township High School on Wednesday, March 15. The concert will be given under the auspices of the Chicago Title and Trust Company, which has been the sponsor of the orchestra's radio broadcasts for the past five years.

No admission charge will be made to the concert, which will be held in the school auditorium, Holman D. Pettibone, president of the Title and Trust Company, said. Ticket distribution will be handled by the school and preference in their distribution will be given pupils and their families. Approximately 1200 persons are expected to attend the program, which will be broadcast over WCFL from 8 to 9 p.m.

While the concert will begin at eight o'clock, guests will be invited to come as early as 7:00, Mr. Pettibone said, so that they may observe the final rehearsal. The Symphony will be under the baton of Conductor Tauno Hannikainen.

Highwood Police Ask For Increase Of 20% In Wage

A petition presented to the Highwood City Council last week by Chief of Police Ted Benvenuti, asked for a 20% increase in wage. The salaries, it stated, are out of line with the cost of living, and the force is the lowest paid on the North Shore. The last raise, two years ago, of \$5 per month, is insufficient to keep pace with the present cost of living, Mr. Benvenuti declared.

The Highwood police force includes four other officers besides Chief Benvenuti: Lt. Roy Dransfeldt, Sgt. Nick Marino and patrolmen Charles Maserati and Dino Pagliai.

The matter was referred to the Police and Finance committee for consideration.
