### Pageant Presented At Girl Scout Father-Daughter Rally

The Girl Scouts of Highland Park celebrated the 38th Birthday of Girl Scouting in America at a Father-Daughter Rally at the Elm Place School Auditorium, March 12 at 3 p.m., at which time a Pageant showing various phases of Girl Scouting was presented. The narrator was Mrs. P. N. Gould, leader of Troop 8, and Mrs. Charles Kluss, leader of Troop 20, was responsible for the theme and narration of the pageant. All the troops were represented in this part of the program. Girl Scouts from Immaculate Conception depicted what may have happened at the first Girl Scout troop meeting on March 12, 1912 in the first scene "The Founding of Girl Scouting". The second scene entitled "The First Step in Scouting", had all the Brownie Scouts standing at their places and singing their favorite Brownie songs. Girl Scouts from the Ravinia and Braeside troops showed a typical moment at Day Camp at Saka-jawea Lodge with the hungry girls gathered around the cooking fires and singing before the meal. "Hands Across the Sea" was the title of the fourth scene which had three parts; one showing a Girl Scout troop preparing a Clothing Kit to be sent overseas, another depicting a French family receiving the Kit, and the third, showing a French Girl Scout troop writing a Thank You letter for the clothing. This scene was given by Scouts from Lincoln and West Ridge schools. Scene Five by Girl Scouts from Oak Terrace, St. James, and Elm Place schools, portrayed a typical evening campfire at the International Encampment at "Our Chalet" in Switzerland with Scouts from every land joining in the fun and entertainment. In the last scene, there was an explanation of the Juliette Low World Friendship Fund which is used for the promotion of Girl Scouting throughout the world, and the Juliette Low representatives from each troop brought the money collected by her troop for the Fund and placed it by the World Emblem. The program closed with the singing of "Girl Scouts Together" and "America the Beautiful."

### Clarence (Cal) Hoff Seeks Republican Nomination For County Sheriff

A policeman for a policeman's job is the keynote of the campaign which Clarence (Cal) Hoff, Waukegan police sergeant, is waging for the Republican nomination for sheriff in the April 11 nomination.

Hoff, making his first bid for a political office, has been a member of the Waukegan police department for the past 22 years, and at the time he took a year's leave of absence to run for office he was in charge of the detective bureau.

A graduate of the FBI Police Academy at Washington, D. C. he is qualified in fingerprinting and crime photography.

Hoff has drafted a constructive five-point program for increasing the efficiency of the sheriff's department as a police force and has added two other important planks in his platform which would remove much of the politics from the office.

Foremost among his plans for the office is the establishment of a traffic bureau as a step in curbing the number of accidents on county highways.

To increase the efficiency of the department he proposes to establish a chain of command to fix department responsibility with promotions for deputies on a merit basis.

A training program for the deputies including all phases of police work is high on the program.

Among the practices which he would eliminate are use of the sheriff's office as a political headquarters and favoritism in law enforcement.

### Library Presents Exhibition On People Of India

The Highland Park Public Library has arranged a showing of the exhibition, PEOPLE OF INDIA, a selection of photographs by Margaret Bourke-White. Prepared by the editors of LIFE Magazine and consisting of twenty-eight panels, PEOPLE OF INDIA will be on view from March 13 to March 27.

The following topics suggest something of the variety of PEOPLE OF INDIA: political leaders; famine; caste; Brahman, Kshatriya, Vaisya, Sudra, Untouchable; Sikhs, Hindus, Moslems; Communists; college classes; stock exchange; traffic; portraits, and miscellaneous scenes of people.
