Summer brings additional bird visitors, such as rose-breasted grosbeaks, orioles, goldfinches, thrushes, warblers and many

"If you would bring birds to your yard or garden," Miss Bergstrom charged, "try at least one feeder with sunflower seeds. Give them a week or two to get used to it, keep it constantly filled; then they will stay. You will be amply rewarded, for the birds will always keep their side of the bar-


