LEGAL

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE NORTH SHORE GAS COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, CERTAIN RIGHTS IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, North Shore Gas Company, an Illinois Corporation, is now operating in the City of Highland Park by virtue of an ordinance passed November 27, 1944, which franchise expired by its terms upon November 27, 1949, and,

WHEREAS, it is deemed proper and to the best interests of its residents that the City of Highland Park at this time grant a new franchise to said North Shore Gas Company, its successors and assigns.

SECTION I. That permission and authority be, and the same is hereby granted to North Shore Gas Company, an Illinois Corporation, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate its gas system for the distribution of gas for heating, lighting, power and other purposes, and to have the right to maintain and operate all gas mains and distribution lines now located in the streets, alleys, public grounds and public places in said City, and the right to construct, maintain and operate new lines of gas mains and branches upon and under all the streets, alleys, public grounds and public places in said City, or which may hereafter become a part of said City, to construct, maintain and operate all necessary connections, services and return pipes and other apparatus necessary or desirable for the effective distribution and utilization of gas for the purposes stated.

SECTION II. That said grantee shall not be permitted to install, maintain or operate any gas mains, or public places, in any manner that will disturb or interfere with any water pipe, sewer, gas pipe, conduit or other underground work now or hereafter laid by said City, or by an authorized company or corporation, and when said grantee shall open ground in any street, avenue, alley, or public place in said City, the grantee shall forthwith restore the said street, pavement, sidewalk, ground, water pipes, conduit or other underground work to a condition equally as good as immediately prior to the opening of said ground by said grantee; water to be furnished by the City under the authority of the City shall be used in filling and setting trenches, the cost thereof to be paid by the grantee, and if grantee fails or refuses to properly fill and restore all trenches opened by it, the same shall be filled by said City and said grantee shall be liable for and pay the costs thereof.

SECTION III. Said grantee shall not erect or encumber any street, avenue, alley or public place at any one time that may be necessary to enable said grantee to proceed with advantage in the laying of such mains, pipes, tubing, feeding or service pipes, nor shall said grantee permit any such streets, avenues, alleys or public places to remain open or encumbered for a longer period than shall be reasonably necessary to complete the work for which the same shall have been opened, or without putting up the barriers or lights to effectually prevent the happening of any accident in consequence of such opening or encumbering of such streets, avenues, alleys or public grounds.

SECTION IV. Said grantee shall lay their mains on such part or parts of the streets of the City of Highland Park as shall designate, and shall furnish to said City a chart showing the location of the entire system of mains, pipes, and appurtenances at the time of the beginning of the supplying of gas, and when additions or extensions are made to said system the grantee shall furnish said City with charts of extensions or additions before work is started.

SECTION V. Said grantee shall indemnify, save harmless and defend the said City from any and all damages or claims, including attorneys' fees, court costs and expenses of litigation, if any, which may result or be alleged to result from carelessness, neglect or misconduct of any officer, agent, servant, or employee of said grantee in the construction and operation of said work.

SECTION VI. In the event that said grantee shall at any time while the within franchise ordinance shall be in force and effect obtain franchise from any municipality of comparable size and circumstances within the area served by said grantee wherein such municipality shall by the terms of such franchise or by supplemental agreement be granted terms, conditions, concessions or remuneration which, in the opinion of the City Council of the City of Highland Park, is more advantageous than the terms, conditions, concessions or remuneration of the within ordinance, and upon which the within franchise is granted, then grantee does covenant and agree, upon notice from the City of Highland Park, to make available to and grant to this City the same terms, awards, concessions or compensations granted to such comparable municipality.

SECTION VII. The rights and privileges herein contained are hereby granted for a period of twenty (20) years from the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION VIII. Within thirty (30) days after the approval of this ordinance, said grantee shall file with the City Clerk of said City an acceptance in writing of all the terms and provisions herein.

LEGAL

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ENCROACHMENT OR FURFURSTURES UPON THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC WAYS OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK (AMENDING SECTIONS 1408 and 1409 OF THE HIGHLAND PARK CITY CODE AND REPEALING OTHER ORDINANCES AND AMENDMENTS RELATING TO THE USE OF PUBLIC STREETS).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. That Section III, Chapter XLVIII of the Highland Park City Code, being Section 1408 thereof, be and the same is hereby amended and as amended shall be and read as follows:

Section 1408. Prohibition Against Private Use of Public Streets. It shall be and is hereby declared unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to construct, erect, maintain or permit to exist upon the surface of any street, alley, public thoroughfare or public lands of the City of Highland Park any building, fence, stairwell, porch, steps, fuel or gasoline pump or loading installation, sign, stand or other obstruction whatsoever, provided, however, that where any such building, fence, stairwell, porch, steps, fuel or gasoline pump or loading installation, sign, stand or other obstruction shall now exist or is presently maintained upon the surface of any such street, alley, public thoroughfare or public grounds, whether pursuant to license issued therefor or otherwise, then the person, firm or corporation so using such street, alley, public thoroughfare or public land shall vacate and remove the same on or prior to the first day of January, 1951.

It shall be and is hereby declared unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to occupy for private use or by the installation of tanks or otherwise, any lands underlying the surface of or any area above any street, alley, public thoroughfare or public lands within the City of Highland Park without having first procured license and permit therefor. Such license or permit for subsurface or overhead occupancy shall be issued only upon application to the City Council and after public hearing upon the question of issuance of such license. No such license shall be issued by the City Council where the interests of the public will be prejudiced and where the interests of the public shall be served thereby, and such license shall issue only upon such conditions as the City Council shall from time to time permit. All such licenses for subsurface or overhead occupancy shall be terminable by the terms thereof at the sole and exclusive election of the City Council and upon the giving of notice to exceed six months notice in writing. Such licenses for subsurface or overhead use shall be issued only upon condition that the licensee shall give bond with good and sufficient surety in such amount as the City Council shall determine and conditioned that said licensee shall indemnify, save harmless and defend the City of Highland Park against any and all claims which may be made or liabilities which may be incurred for or by reason of the issuance of such permits.

SECTION II. That Section IV of Chapter XLVIII, being Section 1409 of the Highland Park City Code be and the same is hereby amended and as amended shall read as follows:

Section 1409. The occupancy of the surface, subsurface or area above any street, alley, sidewalk or public ground in the City of Highland Park by any person, firm or corporation, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, shall constitute such person, firm or corporation guilty of the maintenance of a nuisance without the necessity of the service of notice upon the person so occupying, maintaining the same, and the duly constituted law enforcement officers of the City of Highland Park shall summarily remove or take down the same and the expense of such removal shall be recoverable of the person so constructing, maintaining or erecting the same.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates, neglects or refuses to comply with any of the provisions of this amended ordinance shall on conviction be fined not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$200.00 for each such offense, and every such person, firm or corporation shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for every day on which such violation, neglect and refusal shall continue.

SECTION III. Repeal of Previous Ordinances. The provisions of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Erection and Maintenance of Gasoline Pumps in the Streets and Parkways of the City of Highland Park," Passed June 20, 1927, Approved June 21, 1927, and the provisions of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Limiting the Installation, Operation and Maintenance of Gasoline Pumps in the Streets and Parkways of the City of Highland Park," Passed and Approved October 9, 1925, and the provisions of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance Entitled 'An Ordinance Prohibiting the Erection and Maintenance of Gasoline Pumps in the Streets and Parkways of the City of Highland Park,'" Passed and Approved July 27, 1931, are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording and publication as required by law.
