## LEGAL

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRAFFIC COMMISSION AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PASSED MARCH 10, 1941, APPROVED MARCH 11, 1941" (AMENDING SCHEDULE X PREVIOUSLY ENACTED BY AMENDMENT TO THE ORDINANCE AFORESAID)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That Schedule X attached to and made a part of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Traffic Commission and Establishing Traffic Regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, Passed March 10, 1941, Approved March 11, 1941" and amended thereto, be and the same is further amended by addition to said Schedule X of the following streets or parts of streets:

Clavey Road in the City of Highland Park, along all of its length;

Ridge Road in the City of Highland Park, along all of its length;

West Park Avenue in the City of Highland Park, from Half Day Road to its intersection with Sunnyside Lane.

SECTION II. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or operate a commercial vehicle, other than one carrying not more than five passengers, or any truck having a gross weight, inclusive of load, of less than 3,000 pounds, over, along and upon the certain city streets, thoroughfares or lands dedicated for streets above named, or those portions thereof above named. The foregoing shall not apply to any commercial vehicle engaged in making delivery of goods or passengers to or engaged in receiving goods or passengers from premises situated upon such streets or thoroughfares or portions of streets or thoroughfares above named.

SECTION III. This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording and publication as required by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That Schedule III attached to and made a part of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Traffic Commission and Establishing Traffic Regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, Passed March 10, 1941, Approved March 11, 1941," being that portion of Schedule III under the subheading "Parking Limited to 2 Hours between 8 o'clock A.M. and 6 o'clock P.M. on any day (excepting Sundays and legal holidays)," be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

Upon both the north and south side of Central Avenue from the point of its intersection with Green Bay Road extending westerly to the intersection of said street with the north line of McGovern Street.

SECTION II. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or place any motor vehicle upon that section of Highland Park above described for a continuous period in excess of 2 hours between the hours aforesaid.

SECTION III. This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recording and publication, as required by law.

### Evanston Wins Both Suburban Track Crowns

Evanston Township High school captured the varsity and frosh-soph track titles in the annual Suburban League track meet held last week on the Evanston oval. The varsity scored 69 1/2 points while the frosh-soph scored 49 in taking the double crown.

Oak Park, last year's varsity winner, finished second with 52 points. The frosh-soph's title victory was the third straight for the Wildkits.

Two members of the winning teams, Ted Wheeler of the varsity and Charles Thomas of the frosh-soph, bettered their 1949 marks. Wheeler ran the mile in 4:29.2, while Thomas put the shot 45 feet, 4 1/2 inches.

The Highland Park varsity thin-clads were in last place with 5 1/2 points while the frosh-soph did a little better in scoring 15 1/2 points for fifth place in the final outcome.
