LEGAL
ORDINANCE NO. 50-0-70
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHWOOD:
Section 1: Hereafter, all vehicles parked on Greenbay Road from the south city limits to the north city limits shall be parked parallel to the curb. It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on Greenbay Road at an angle to the curb at any time. The Chief of Police, with the assistance of the Street Department, shall erect appropriate warning signs along Greenbay Road.
Section 2: Whenever any person, firm or corporation is found guilty of violating any provision of this ordinance, the violator shall be subject to a penalty of not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

Other churches they served were Washington Park church in Denver; Tacoma Washington's First Methodist church; First Methodist Church in Colorado Springs, and at present are at the First Methodist church at Seattle, Washington.

Robert Albertson has three brothers and three sisters; one brother passed away in childhood. Besides Robert, another brother is a minister at Ferndale, Washington, and one is a teacher in the public schools in Seattle, Washington.

Robert and his wife Aileen moved (following his graduation from Colorado State College), to the Chicago area to attend seminary.

This June Robert will graduate from Garrett, will be ordained into the Christian ministry at the altar of the church he has served during his seminary training, the Wesley Methodist church of Highland Park-Highwood, Illinois.

Present for the ordination will be his parents, Cyrus and Clara Albertson, as well as his sister and brother, Barbara and Richard.
