Christian Science Church Holds Annual Meeting In Boston

Vast new evidences of the power of pure Christianity to solve mankind's problems in modern times were reported recently by The Christian Science Board of Directors.

Emphasizing "the meaning of pure Christianity" for the present age, the Directors pointed to concrete evidence that spiritual power can be utilized to heal disease, enlarge individual capacity, provide "sure guidance," uncover hidden resources, and provide without measure "the precise good that is needed" by every individual in every human circumstance.

Throughout the main session ran the theme of the validity and power of Christianity to answer the problems of the modern age. Walter S. Cross of Fitchburg, Mass., Christian Science practitioner and incoming President of The Mother Church, declared in his keynote address:

"Men need a deeper understanding of God and His laws in order to cope with the present-day chaos and confusion in world affairs... There is an answer to the mesmeric doctrines of tyranny and mental domination which would spread terrorism over large areas of the globe. The answer lies in the spiritual realm, and is available now."

Steady progress was recorded in reports of various Christian Science activities. George Channing, Manager of Committees on Publication, reported that insurance companies and state laws in growing number recognize the validity of Christian Science treatment, and the right of Christian Scientists to practice their religion by relying wholly upon prayer for physical healing.
