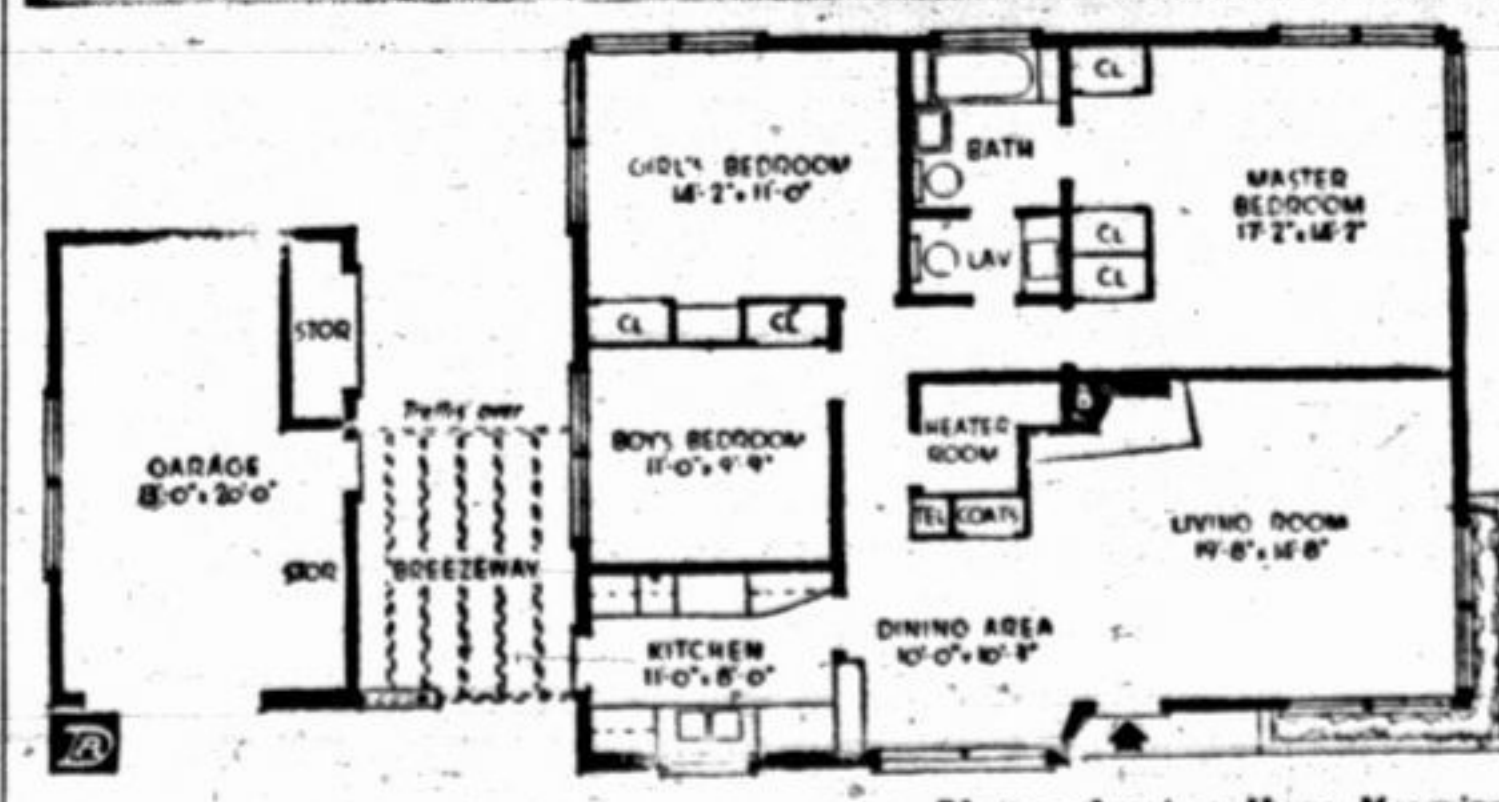

## Will YOU Be State Fair Queen?

SPRINGFIELD—Some young lady between the ages of 18 and 24 will be State Fair Queen this year. Will it be YOU?

Any Illinois girl who meets the simple requirements of the contest can become eligible for the following prizes:

A 1950 Ford Convertible as Grand Prize; a week's vacation at Wilbur Clark's Desert Inn at Las Vegas; a weekend at the Edgewater Beach Hotel, Chicago; a set of Stetson China; a Westinghouse Laundromat; a Greyhound Bus trip to Las Vegas; a Revere movie camera; an Elgin National watch; Gantner sweaters and swim suits, and Luxite gown and Hohenroof hosiery.

In addition, the Queen will be official Hostess at the State Fair,

and will take part in radio shows, presentation of trophies and many other thrilling events.

The contest rules are simple. An applicant must be unmarried, between the ages of 18 and 24, and a resident of Illinois. Daily newspapers in ten cities are sponsoring contests to choose the ten finalists for the State Fair Queen awards. Cities in which contests are to be held are:

Springfield, Bloomington, Alton, Decatur, Marion, Rockford, Kankakee, Rock Island-Moline, Peoria and Danville.

Entry blanks and contest rules can be obtained at these newspaper offices. Prizes will be offered in the local contests, with the winner becoming a candidate for the State Fair Queen Crown.
