Fun Packed, Tune Packed Roberta In Spotlight At Music Theatre

Top tunes.
Hilarious, ad-libbing comedians.
And smooth direction.

All blend together in Jerome Kern's gay and immortal operetta, "Roberta", at Barrie O'Daniels' Music Theater this week.

The largest first night audience we've seen so far this year braved a cloudburst and welcomed back: Harry Stockwell (as All-American fullback John Kent); Andzia Kuzak (as Roberta's royal seamstress); and Tim Herbert and Don Saxon, best pair of comedians we've seen in a long, long time.

"Roberta", packed with tunes like "Smoke Gets In Your Eyes", "You're Devastating", "The Touch of Your Hand", "I Won't Dance", and others, is the story of an American football star who inherits his Aunt's dress shop in Paris. Aunt Roberta is convincingly played by Evelyn Reynolds.

Versatile star Sybil Bowan, newcomer this week who, in 1947, appeared in a command performance before the King and Queen of England, adds spark to the peppy operetta, and critical first nighters guffawed at her antics, particularly her portrayal of a nurse's aid.

But the show is really paced by Herbert whose ad-libbing, fluffs, facial expressions and general all around zaniness kept the appreciative audience laughing throughout the play.

Harry Stockwell and charming Andzia Kuzak handled their leads well. And ex-Tenthouse star, Bonnie Heller, as Kent's bossy and pretty fiance, did a capable job in her role.

Others who make "Roberta" one of the best Music Theater shows of this summer are: Tomi Romer, Jack Harrold, John Bankhurst, Aristides Copulas, June Dunn, Pat Ward and Jim Demarest.

The ballet dancers, altho not as well rehearsed as usual, still did some mighty fine dancing, particularly in their opening number, "Let's Begin".
Yes, you'll enjoy "Roberta".

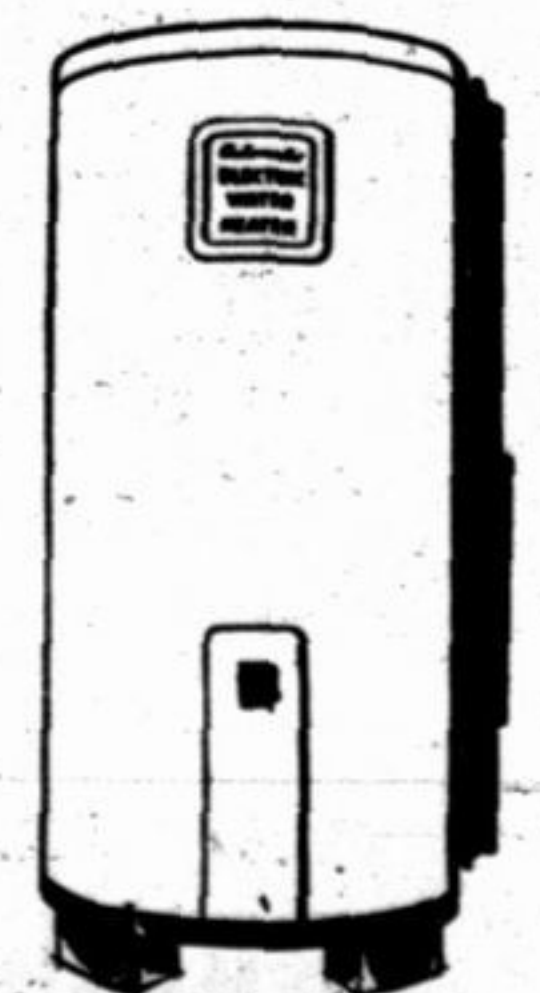
