## Into And The Hollywood Plants

There is an old saying—"You must learn something new every day or you are going backwards." My trouble is I see so many new things, and they all have names two inches long, which I can't pronounce nor remember when they are pronounced for me. When I ask for an English name, Ito the Jap gardener says, "It belongs to the lily family, or the aster group—" or some other well known flower.

We are having the upper patio changed—had to move a tree that was casting too much shade. Ito was given permission to put in some flowers. He sure knows how to arrange flowering plants. The ground slopes, and in the highest corner he placed a large plant, loaded with huge pink buds, and we were told when the buds opened we would be surprised. A few days later four buds opened. They were deep purple. The contrast of pink, purple and green just held our gaze. It is fascinating and we are told it will bloom all summer. It is semi-tropical.

A hanging basket has great clusters of fuchsia blooms, they are also in the pink, purple and green combination.

Recently we met a Mrs. Morgan, who is in the plant raising business. Seeing we were interested in flowers, she asked us to visit her establishment. We came away with a Prayer Plant. During the day it looks like any other well-cared-for plant, but when night comes, the two leaves facing each other close together and look like a pair of hands with palms touching in prayer.

Another plant, belonging to the coleus family, sends out a long shoot which looks like a piece of dark thread. When it reaches the edge of the pot, it drops down and some tiny leaves sprout out. We have not been told what it will do next, so we watch this plant every day.

Couple of weeks ago I noticed Ito put in pairs, all along the garden back to the wall, something that looked like sticks. I supposed they were markers where he had put in some seeds. A few days ago I noticed something red on each side of these sticks. It was leaves. This is the way poinsettia start, and they will bloom at Christmas.

One thing I have learned: put all plants wanting lots of water together and those wanting dry soil on the other side of the walk.

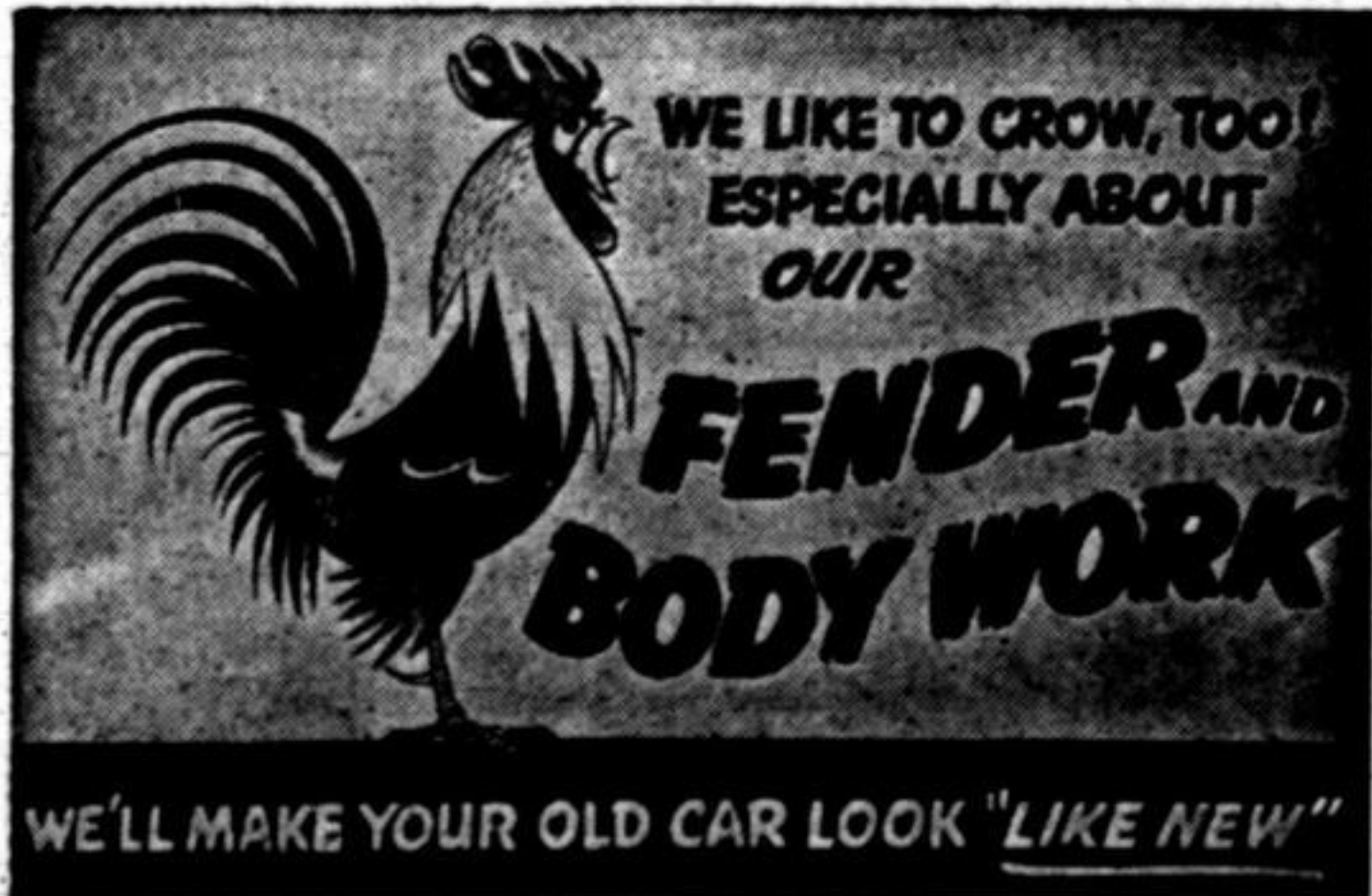
