PUBLIC NOTICE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRAFFIC COMMISSION AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PASSED MARCH 10, 1941, APPROVED MARCH 11, 1941" (AND AMENDING SCHEDULE I ATTACHED THERETO)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That Schedule I attached to and made a part of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Traffic Commission and Establishing Traffic Regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, Passed March 10, 1941, Approved March 11, 1941," be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto that portion of such schedule prohibiting parking at any time, as follows:

Upon the East side of Oakwood Avenue from the point of its intersection with Walnut Street in said City Southerly to the intersection of Oakwood Avenue with Deerfield Avenue in said City.

SECTION II. This amending ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recordation and publication, as required by law.

This is the highest number of points a team can possibly score in a duel meet and was made possible by placing 1st and 2nd in all events plus winning the medley relay and free style relay.

The team was led by Allen Rubenstein who won the 50 yard breast stroke and the 75 yard medley. Robert Stanwood won the 50 yard back stroke and led the medley relay to victory. John Gould won the 50 yard crawl and placed second in the 100 yard crawl. Paul Day won the 100 yard crawl. Don Reitz won the diving. Other boys who contributed to the team victory were: Fred Harris, Elwood Hansmann, James Barton, John Adams, Thomas Harter, William Davidow, Tom Keim, Lewis Phelps and Peter Husting.

The team looked good for the first meet and displayed some real spirit. Times will improve with more practice.

Despite its name, allspice is just one spice. It comes from the pimento tree (not pimento, the red pepper) and derives the name, allspice, because its flavor suggests a blend of nutmeg, cinnamon and cloves.

Put some of the ol' shinolins on that vacation-racked suitcase of yours. It will remove dust and grime, hide unsightly scratches and rejuvenate its color and luster.

Have you tried rolling pie crust around the rolling pin to set it in your pie pan? You let the dough roll around the rolling pin; lift it from the board and unroll the pastry on the pie pan. The rolling pin supports the tender crust so it does not stretch or break while being moved.
