

Ice Capades Of 1951 Coming To Chicago Arena In March

Superlatives have been heaped upon Ice Capades ice skating revues in the past but there are none which are adequate to describe the glittering masterpiece that is Ice Capades of 1951, coming to the Chicago Arena for a 14-day engagement starting March 15. Saturday and Sunday matinees are scheduled March 17, 18, 24 and 25. Tickets have been placed on sale at the Arena and Lytton's.

The "Lucky Edition" is a constant parade of show-topping performances presented in a succession of exquisitely beautiful settings. Undoubtedly, the astounding success of Ice Capades down through the years has been due largely to the fact that Producer John H. Harris has dared to be different and explored possibilities far removed from the orthodox format for ice production.

That originality comes into full bloom in the 1951 edition with the arrival on ice of "Student Prince", one of the greatest of all operettas. Never before was the unforgettable romantic musical given as beautiful a production. It is far beyond anything even Sigmund Romberg, the composer, could have dreamed. A cast of 100 is utilized.

One of its most welcome achievements is bringing the lovely Donna Atwood back to Ice Capades to join with spectacular Bobby Specht, thus re-uniting the skating world's finest team. The gorgeous red-headed Donna is the perfect "Kathie" the pretty waitress who falls in love with the prince. Specht, of course, is the prince and once again proves he is not only the best of the current male stars, but also by far the most versatile.

"Student Prince" is only one of ten lavish production numbers. Besides Donna and Bobby, the cast is the greatest ever assembled for an ice show.
