SODA MAKES LIGHT EASTER CAKE



Tender, moist lusciousness charactorizes chocolaté cakes made with baking sada. Bake one for a festive Easter celebration.

EASTER CAKE 2 cups sifted cake flour 1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup vinegar % cup milk 1 teaspoon vanilla

1 % cups sugar 1/2 cup shortening 3 squares chocolate, melted

Set even at 350° F. Line 2'8-Inch layer pans, 11/4 inches deep, with waxed paper. Grease waxed paper lightly. Sift cake flour onto a piece of waxed paper. Measure 2 cups. Place in sifter. Add baking seds and salt. Set aside. Mix tegether vinegar, milk and vanilla. Set aside. Put aggs and sugar in large mixing bowl. Beat for one minute, about 125 strakes. Sift in Sour mixture. Add shortening and one-half of milk mixture. Stir until Rour is moistened. Boat vigorously one minute. Add remaining Hauld Turn into prepared pans. Bake at 350° F., 30 minutes. Cool in pane on wire rack about 10 minutes. paper. When cold, brush off grumbs. Place one layer on cake plate bottom side up. Spread with your favorite frosting. Cover with second layer top side up. Frest sides then top of cake.
