not later than June 30, 1951. Collector Jarecki asked that taxpayers refrain from sending 1951... letters, telephoning or coming to the Collector's office in connection with expected refunds on income tax for 1950 until July 2, 1951. In this way taxpayers will assist in expediting the refunding-

program. The Collector also stated that if taxpayers will cooperate in the manner requested that he was certain that very few people will find it necessary to contact his office after June 30, 1951, regarding their failure to receive refunds shown to be due them on their income tax returns for the calendar year 1950.
