

Highland Park Men Among Sponsors Of Evanston Hospital Fund

Mr. Franklin J. Lunding, 903 N. Sheridan Road, Mr. Howell W. Murray, 31 N. Linden, and Mr. Sidney L. Schwarz, 215 Orchard Lane, are among the 53 prominent North Shore citizens, who will serve as sponsors in the \$225,000 fund-raising effort for the Community Hospital of Evanston, to begin May 1st, it was announced this week by General Campaign Chairman Earl J. Rusnak of Evanston.

Headed by Evanston's distinguished citizen, former Vice-President Charles G. Dawes, Honorary Chairman for the drive, the list of sponsors includes businessmen, educators, civic leaders, clergymen, and lay citizens from every North Shore community between Chicago and Lake Forest.

Dr. J. Roscoe Miller, President of Northwestern University, one of the fifty-three sponsors, summed up the essential reasons for support of the Community Hospital drive in a statement prepared for the hospital's campaign brochure to be distributed when the drive opens May 1st.

"The Community Hospital of Evanston is calling upon citizens of the North Shore to help obtain much-needed funds for a new modern 56-bed hospital. Among our local hospitals there is none with greater need. For over 20 years its 28 beds and 7 bassinets have been crowded into a building originally designed as a residence. Ever present fire hazards, grossly inadequate room space and medical facilities, and needs of the community served by this hospital urge support of this civic project."

According to Chairman Earl J. Rusnak, heading Community Hospital's final Building Fund drive, three-fourths (\$650,000) of the money needed for a new hospital building is already guaranteed, if the remaining goal of \$225,000 can be raised from North Shore citizens. Ground breaking on the new 56-bed hospital unit, to cost approximately \$900,000 is expected to take place in June.
