Pacific railroad company against the Bensenville schools. The Supreme Court held that the lawful rate of a school district in 1947 was that determined by a formula in section 162a of the revenue act.

Bensenville, like many other Illinois districts, believed their lawful rate was one half the rate in effect previous to the passage of the revenue act (Butler bills). Bensenville held a referendum to go to their maximum rate of \$1.125 from their then reduced rate of \$1.90, and further that Bensenville should have held three referendums instead of one to reach their maximum rate.

The schools in this area were advised in 1945 and 1946 by competent legal counsel that only one referendum was required. The schools are now obliged to comply with the Supreme Court decision and the legislation adopted affords the opportunity to validate the previously established maximum rate.

Schools affected by the decision could not possibly operate on the revenue provided by the lawful rates left to them. Hence all such districts must validate their present approved rates. State legislation has made it possible for school districts to do this before September 1, 1951. The schools of Lake, Cook and Dupage Counties and many schools throughout the state, have chosen May 19 to validate their educational rates.

The cause of polio is still unknown, but Dr. Lewin explained that flies have been ground and injected into animals, immediately infecting them with the disease. A vaccine has been discovered which will prevent polio in animals, but as yet has not been tried for human beings.
Dr. Lewin presented slides and

diagrams showing post polio treatment. The author of a book on the disease, he gained fame last year when an English girl came to this country to consult him. Unable to move at that time, she is now a pupil at the Spalding School for Crippled Children and is able to walk with the aid of braces and crutches.

Dr. Lewin was introduced by Mrs. George Martin, president of the Highwood hospital-auxiliary.
