Thousands of sailors and Waves will put on their dress blues May 19 to act as hosts at Great Lakes Naval Training Center.

Residents of Lake County will have their best opportunity of the year to see their Navy in action as the world's largest naval training center throws open its gates to Day.

The Saturday open house will mark the first time since the beginning of the Korean conflict that visiting at Great Lakes has been unrestricted. Beginning at 10 a.m. visitors can go into the Center without passes.

A full day of colorful events will be climaxed at 3 p.m. with a military review in which Vice Admiral Richard L. Conolly will take the salute from more than 5,000 recruits on Ross Field.
