Grandparents are August Berg of Chicago and Mrs. Rose Binz, also of Chicago.

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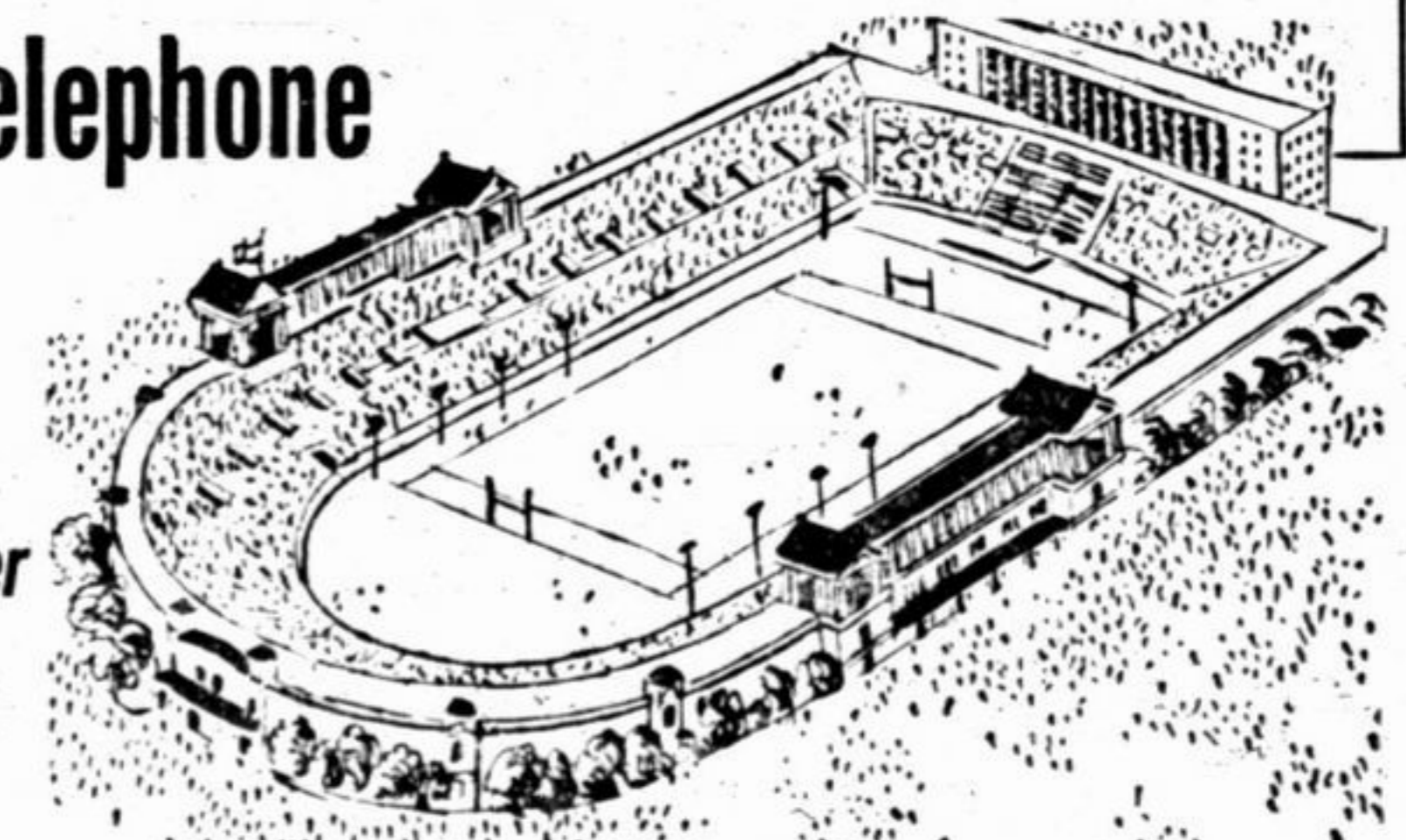
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
