**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION I OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A GARBAGE DEPARTMENT FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS," PASSED MAY 5, 1939.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That Section 1 of an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Creating a Garbage Department For The City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois," be amended, and as amended shall read as follows:

SECTION I. That there is hereby created and established an Executive Department of the Municipal Government of the City of Highland Park, to be known as the Garbage Department, which Department shall be under the supervision of the Commissioner of Public Property. All employees in the Garbage Department shall be under the supervision of the Commissioner of Public Property.

SECTION II. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION III. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and recordation.

## LEGAL NOTICE

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE VII OF CHAPTER V OF THE HIGHLAND PARK CODE OF 1919 AS AMENDED.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. That Section 214 of Article VII, Chapter V, of the Highland Park Code of 1919, as amended, being all of said Article VII, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

214.—DEPARTMENT CREATED.—1. The Department of Buildings heretofore created shall be continued as a department of the Municipal Government of this City, and shall embrace all matters relating to the control of building and zoning and enforcement of the Ordinances relating thereto. The Administrative Head of such Department shall be the Building Inspector, who shall supervise the work and employees of such Department on such employments as have been heretofore or may be hereafter created, all under the direction and control of the Commissioner of Public Health and Safety in whose jurisdiction such Department is hereby placed.

SECTION II. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

## State Drivers' Licenses

Springfield, Ill., May 19—Secretary of State Edward J. Barrett has announced a change, effective immediately, in the processing of state driver licenses. In the future data on the license will be in white on a black background. At present, the wording appears in black on a white card.

The change, Mr. Barrett said, was made for purposes of efficiency and to lessen the opportunity for fraudulent use of licenses. The new process will eliminate a complete work operation and speed up issuance of licenses.

The black on white card has in the past, according to law enforcement officers, made it easy for minors to change the data to advance their age and many criminals found it convenient for the purpose of concealing their identity. A white on a black card is expected to make it almost impossible to alter the new license.

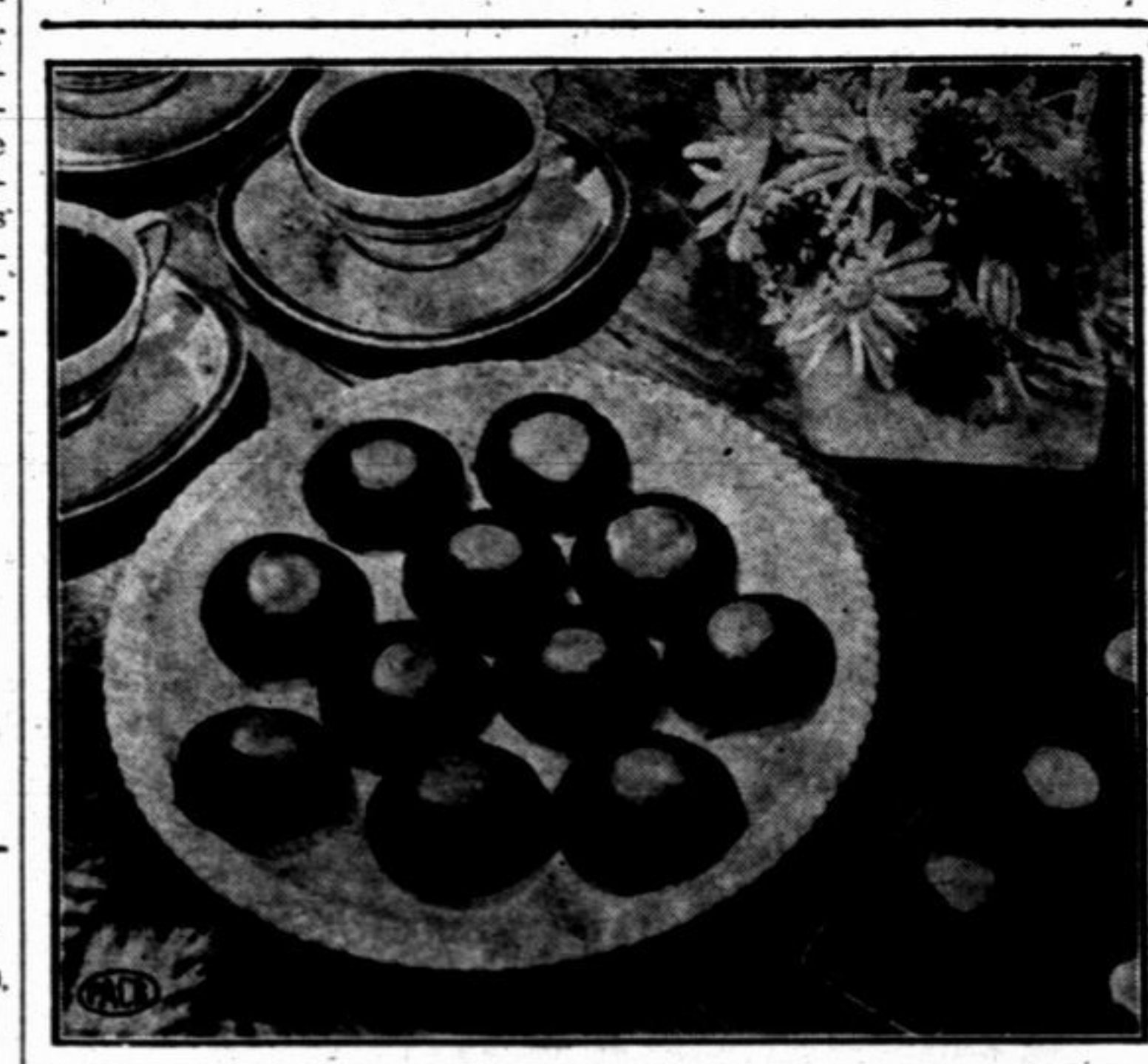
