The public is invited to this benefit.

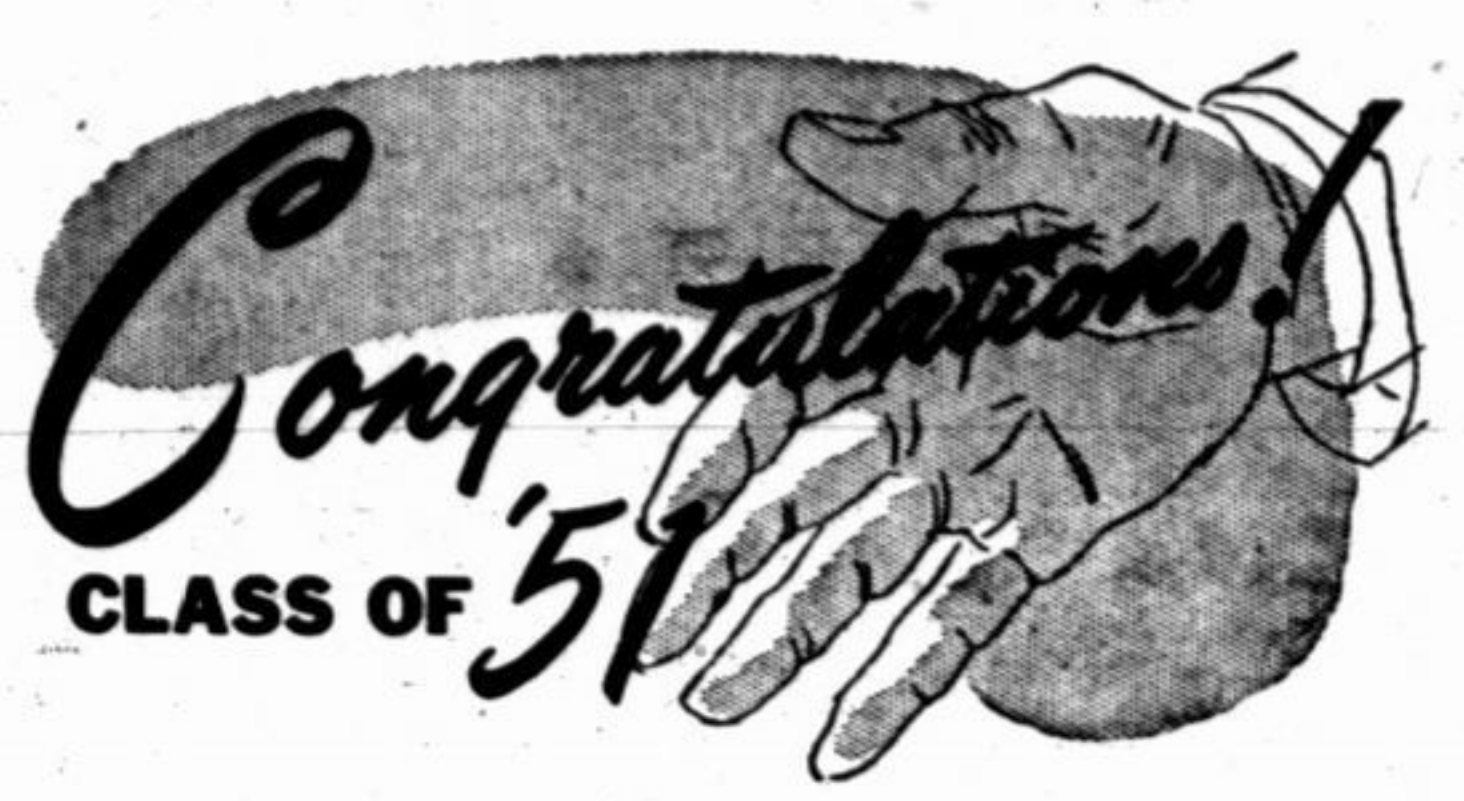

**Royal Neighbors**

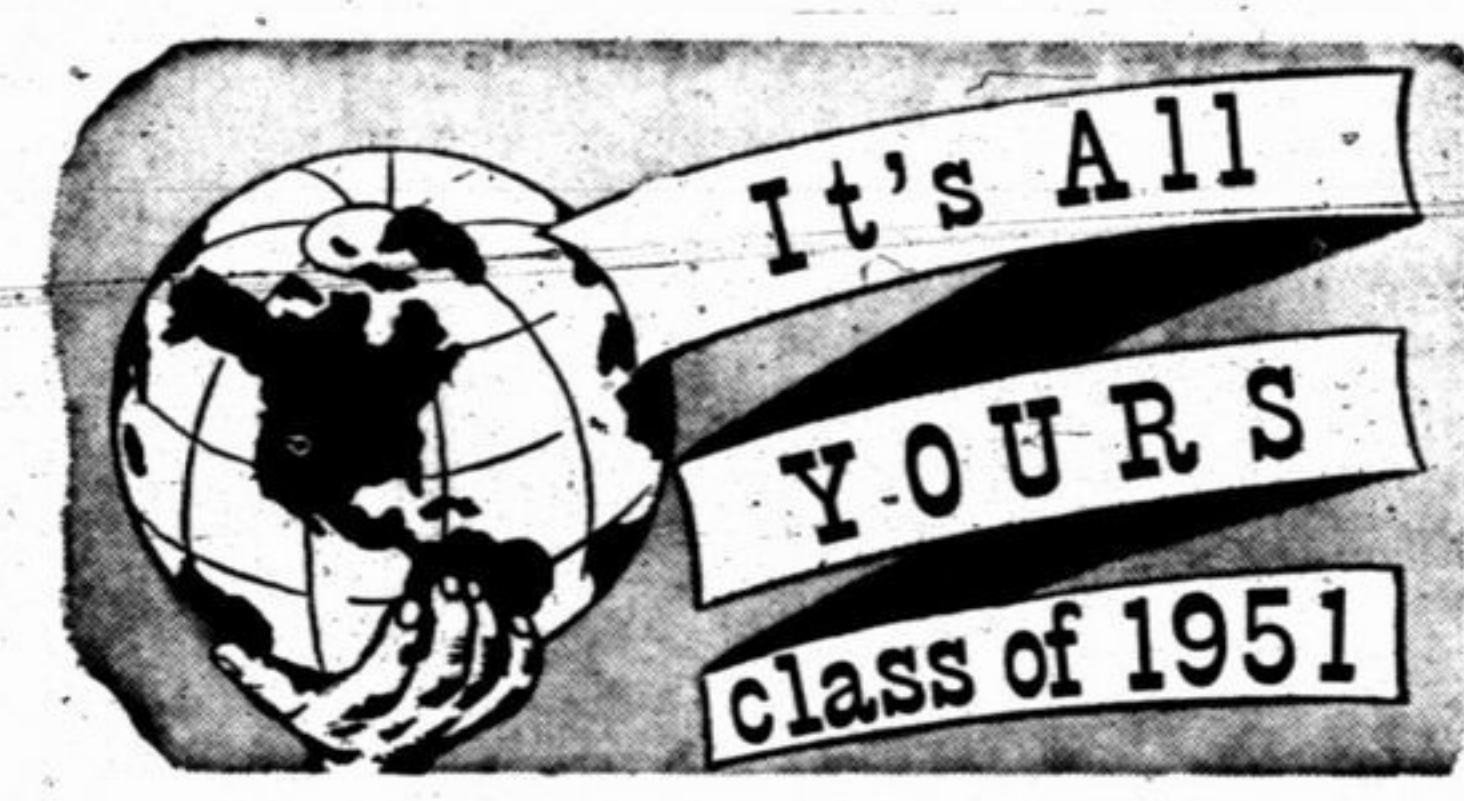

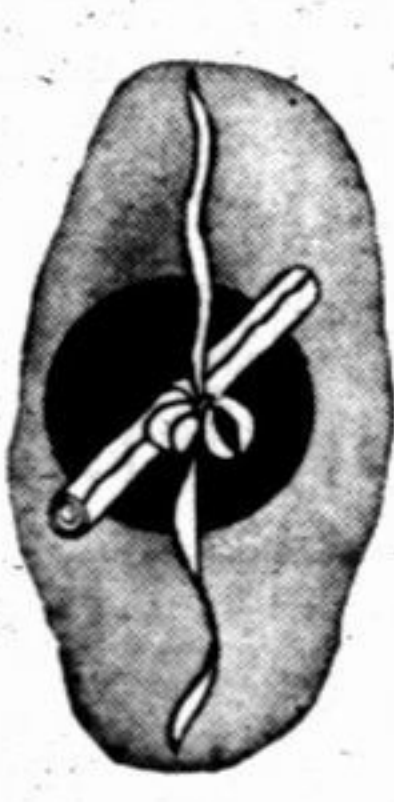
