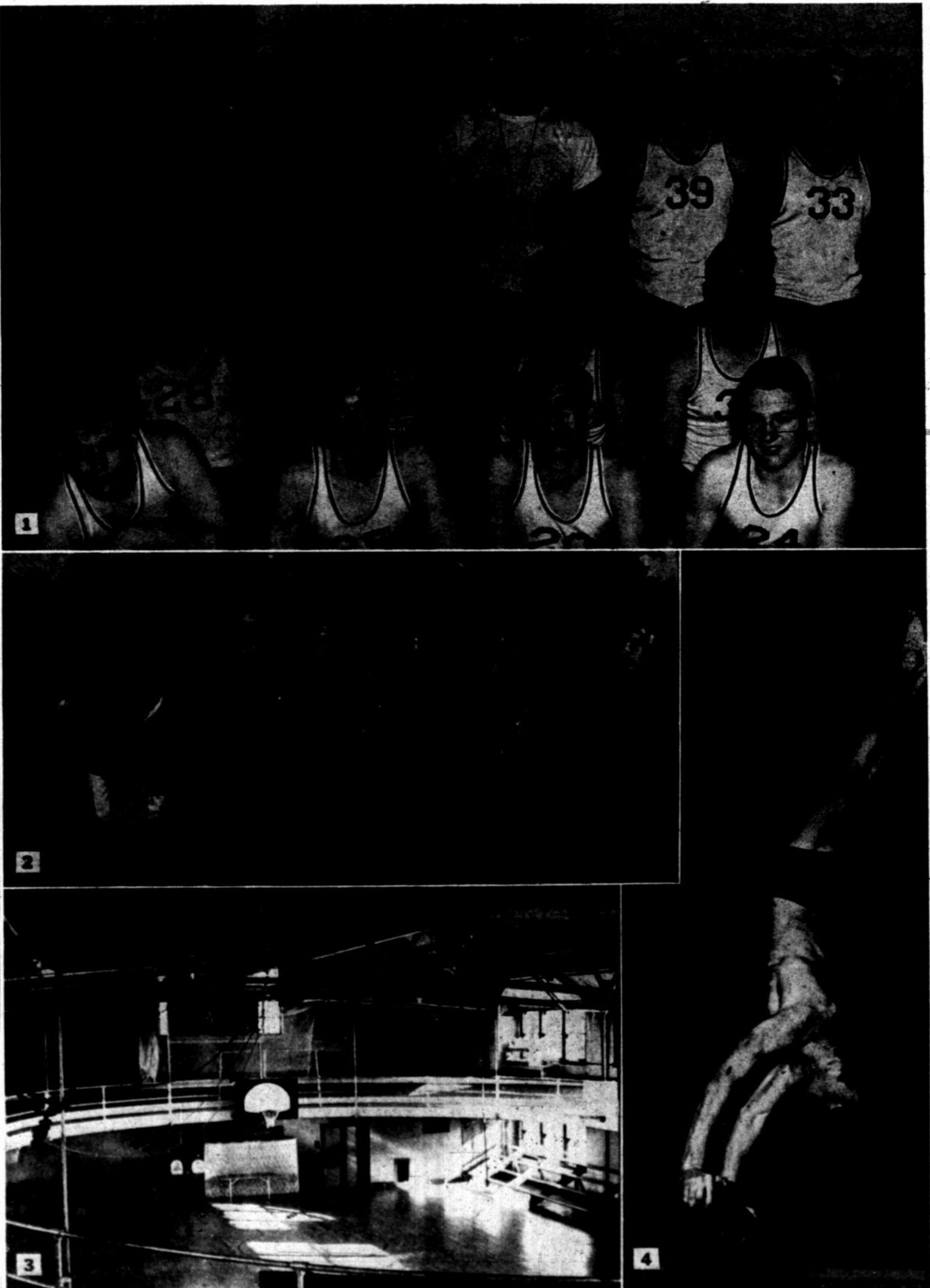
## Students Who Participated In Building H. S. Home

The Highland Park High School has given practical vocational training for the past twenty-six years preparing those students who prefer a career in the building trades. The house now on exhibit was a two year project. Plans, specifications and material estimates were developed during the first year, with the foundation and rough grading completed before

the end of that school term. The second year was spent on the upper structure and the completion of the project. Through the co-operation of the local building trades, every phase of the work was supervised and approved by skilled craftsmen, which resulted in invaluable practical instruction for the students.
