



Boy and Girl Scouts Pledge Assistance To Anti-Fireworks Campaign

Boy and Girl Scouts of America have pledged assistance to Attorney General Ivan A. Elliott at the opening of the fifth anti-fireworks campaign which is sponsored by the Illinois Society for the Prevention of Blindness.

Attorney General Elliott viewed with alarm the report that some children are ordering fireworks by mail and that these children have been found selling these fireworks to their playmates. General Elliott warned parents that they are responsible under the law and that he is calling for rigid enforcement and renewed vigilance from all enforcement officers throughout the state. Attorney General Elliott commended the Boy and Girl Scouts for setting a good example for other children.

"It is important that our boys and girls learn to respect the law rather than to think it is a mischievous prank to violate it. What is worse, when fireworks are involved, their own safety and that of their playmates is endangered. An eye shot out by fireworks can never be replaced."

General Elliott congratulated the Illinois Society for the Prevention of Blindness for its leadership in this safety measure which is "an extremely worthwhile undertaking on behalf of every boy and girl in Illinois".

Attorney General Elliott recalled that a freak fireworks accident some years ago cost him the sight of his right eye.
