### Draft Board Calls For Four Lake County Men During July

No Lake county physicians will be included in the Illinois call for 69 doctors to be inducted into the armed services on July 23, according to Chief Draft Clerk H. J. Reardon.

Only two men from board 150 and two from 151 were inducted on July 2. Another 8 men from board 151 and four from board 150 will be summoned for physical examinations on July 11. Board 150 covers Winthrop Harbor, Zion, Waukegan and North Chicago. Board 151 includes the rest of Lake county.

The draft program has been slowing down recently, it is noted. Following the outbreak of the Korean conflict, men were inducted at the rate of some 80 to 100 per month. During May under two dozen were inducted from Lake county.

### Norge Summer Ski Meet

For almost fifty years, Chicagoland ski fans have been thrilled by the performances of the Flying Daredevils who compete in the Norge Ski Club's annual January Ski tournament. Now, however, something new has been added, a sort of "Man bites Dog" twist, as Norge Officials are preparing the first summer ski meet ever to be held in Chicago land.

The meet will be held July 22 on the club's grounds in Fox River Grove, Ill., on a new hill, especially designed for summer tournaments, in which leaps of 100 feet or more are expected.

The hill will first be covered with straw and then with 200 tons of artificial snow. It will finally be sprayed with snow cement, a

new chemical shipped from Portland, Ore., which is guaranteed to keep the snow from melting, at least 10 hours, even in a temperature of 100 degrees. This man-made snow, experts agree, will assure an even faster slide than natural snow.

Approximately 100 of America's top skiers are expected to enter. They will be headed by the United States Olympic squad which will compete in the Olympic Winter Games in Oslo, Norway, next year. The squad is composed of the present United

States champion Art Tokle from Brooklyn, Art Devlin, Lake Placid, N.Y., Billy "The Kid" Olsen, Eau Claire and the Ishpeming, Mich., contingent of Jumping Joe Perrault, Ralph Bietala and Wilbur Rasmussen. Among local skiers entered are United States Senior champion, Howard Jansen, and Marty Wingsness veteran Norge rider.

(1.) Meat should be chewed as little as possible, says Dr. Daniel C. Munro in his book, *Man Alive, You're Half Dead*. Meat is a protein and is more easily digested if not chewed well. Just the opposite is true of vegetables, Dr. Munro points out, because the alkaline content of vegetables combines with the stomach's gastric juices to aid digestion. Carnivorous animals have been found to digest more easily large chunks of meat than ground meat. Since man may roughly be classified as carnivorous, such findings apply to him.

(2.) Milton Mayer in a *Better Homes and Gardens* article tells us that the Cleveland Board of Education, Police Department and Automobile Club, assisted by the Ohio Motor Vehicle Department, conducted a study and found that 10.4 per cent of boy drivers had accidents, against only 1.4 per cent of girls. Masculine traits of aggressiveness and dare-deviltry were blamed for the greater percentage of accidents of boy drivers. The study shows that high school driving instruction cut the teen-age accidents in half.

(3.) A machine using radioactive cobalt needles to replace expensive radium in cancer therapy, now in production at the University of Texas, is known as "poor man's radium," according to Kathleen Lamb Whalen's magazine article, *Damon Runyon Still Fights Cancer*. The machine which will produce effects equivalent to millions of dollars worth of radium has received much of its financial aid from publicly subscribed funds, including the Damon Runyon Memorial Fund for Cancer Research.
