The histamine in turn dilates the blood vessels so that the tissues which the blood vessels feed become swollen and gorged, like the stomach of a man who has eaten far too much. When the tissues of the mucous membrane of the nose get this indigestion and stomachache, the result is hay-fever or perhaps rhinitis. Other tissues so afflicted may result in hives, asthma or worse.

Histamine thus acts as a sort of fifth columnist in the body for allergens. But it was only recently that histamine's devious underground work was discovered. Once that was established, however, the research laboratories got to work and developed the so-called antihistaminics. Of these, Neohetramine, as shown in the Criep-Aaron report, is the least likely to produce in the patient such sneezing, face swelling and side reactions as dizziness and drowsiness.
