### Patrolman Campbell Wins Skirmish With Death

A Highland Park policeman, Cecil Campbell, narrowly missed death when shot at by one of four suspects he was questioning last week.

He had stopped to question and procure identification from three occupants, all colored, of a Cadillac sedan parked in a driveway of a home on Clavey rd., west of Skokie highway.

While he was talking to the men, one of them attempted to leave. Campbell blocked the door. Then a fourth man stepped up and slugged him with a blackjack from behind.

As he fell a companion in the back seat fired three shots, one of which passed through the crown of Campbell's uniform hat.
