 From "The Gentle Art of Making Enemies." In James A. McNeill Whistler's "The Gentle Art of Making Enemies," he has this to say:  
 "Taste has long been confounded with capacity, and accepted as sufficient qualification for the utterance of judgment in music, painting, poetry. Art is joyously received as a matter of opinion; and that it should be based upon laws as rigid and defined as those of the known sciences, is a supposition no longer to be tolerated by

modern cultivation. For whereas no polished member of society is at all affected at admitting himself neither engineer, mathematician, nor astronomer, and therefore remains willingly discreet and taciturn upon these subjects, still would he be offended were he supposed to have no voice in what is clearly, to him, a matter of taste."

And again, "A life passed among pictures makes not a painter—else the policeman (guard) in the National Gallery might assert himself. As well allege that he who lives in a library must needs die a poet. Let not Mr. Ruskin flatter himself that more education makes the difference between himself and the policeman when both stand gazing in the Gallery."

## New Speaker On International Lutheran Radio Program

The Rev. Armin C. Oldsen, formerly professor of religion at Valparaiso university, has been named new permanent speaker on the International Lutheran Hour, the world's most widespread religious radio program.

The Rev. Prof. Oldsen will be presented officially at a gigantic Lutheran Hour rally, Sunday, September 30, 1951, at the Chicago stadium. This rally, sponsored by 250 Lutheran churches in Chicago and Northern Illinois, will feature colorful pageantry and massed choral music.

The rally will inaugurate the 19th consecutive season of broadcasting for this program, known

as "Bringing Christ to the Nations." An international audience of 20 million listeners will hear these weekly religious broadcasts in 36 languages over 1,034 stations in 52 countries.
