AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE CREATING A TRAFFIC COMMISSION AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, PASSED MARCH 10, 1941.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That Schedule I of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance creating a traffic commission and establishing traffic regulations for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois," passed March 10, 1941, be and the same is hereby amended by adding to said Schedule I the following:

On Elm Place west of Second Street, to Green Bay Road.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, recordation and publication, as required by law.

Mrs. **Clara M. Grossman**, 2342 Highmoor, died at her home last Tuesday, after a brief illness, at the age of 52.



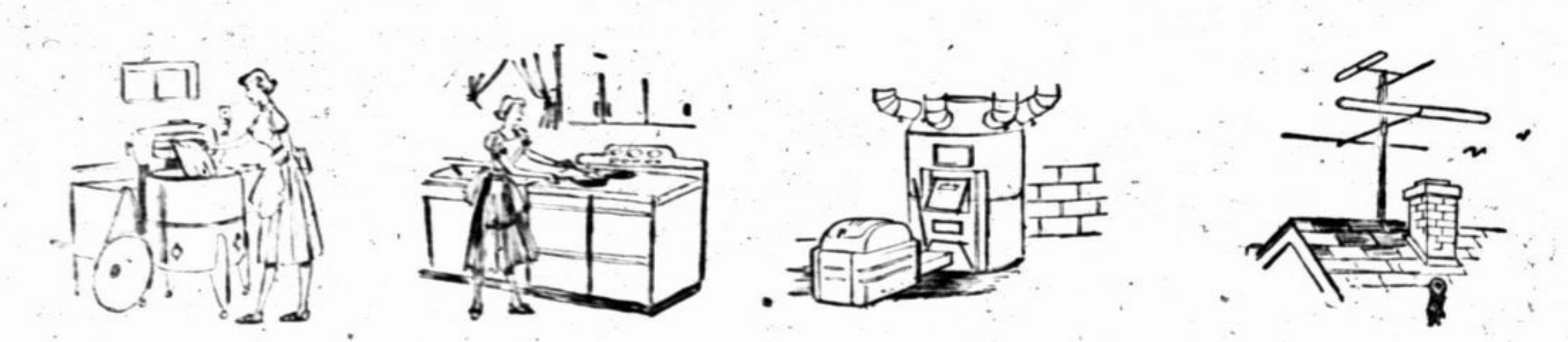
