
#### **Home & Recreation Show**

and 11, in Bancroft, trying to get sufficient commitments cellular service to make this project feasible.

A petition had been circulated here this spring, and had gathered in excess of 800 names. That prompted Bell Cellular officials to consider, "Let's send out our representatives. Let's find out what the requirements are."

If 250 people interested, were Be 11 Cellular could see its way clear to build the 3 towers needed to provide good cellular phone service in this area. At present there is a "dead area" for effective reception, from Apsley north.

Good cellular service phone would require the building of three towers, at a cost of about \$1 million each. They would be in:

- \* APSLEY,
- \* PAUDASH, and
- \* BANCROFT.

Each tower would provide reliable service for a radius of about 15 miles.

Harry Lawrenson and other officials were in the Bancroft Municipal Office until Friday, June 16.

Two retail dealers: T.A.S. of Belleville; and TAB Paging of Peterborough were at the Home and Recreation Show, and taking also the names of people committed to use the new Cellular service if/when it is provided.

More names and commitments still needed.

This Cellular telephone service allows the caller to be mobile, and still use the telephone. Typical use is car phones. which are battery operated or plug into the cigarette lighter. Additional use would be hand held, mobile telecommunications units.
