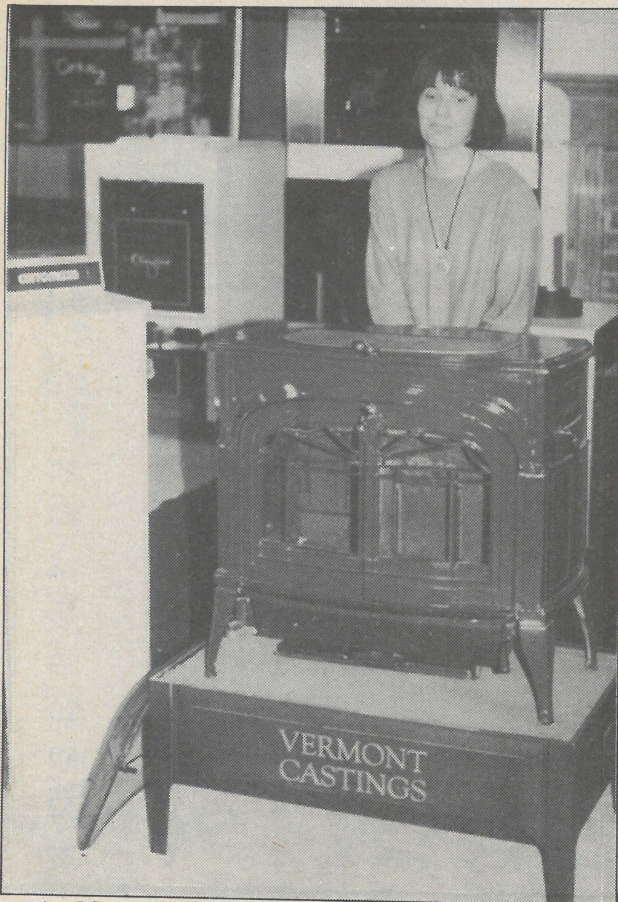


Home & Recreation Show

and 11, in Bancroft, trying to get sufficient commitments for cellular service to make this project feasible.

A petition had been circulated here this spring, and had gathered in excess of 800 names. That prompted Bell Cellular officials to consider, "Let's send out our representatives. Let's find out what the requirements are."

If 250 people were interested, Bell Cellular could see its way clear to build the 3 towers needed to provide good cellular phone service in this area. At present there is a "dead area" for effective reception, from Apsley north.

Good cellular phone service would require the building of three towers, at a cost of about \$1 million each. They would be in: * APSLEY, * PAUDASH, and * BANCROFT.

Each tower would provide reliable service for a radius of about 15 miles.

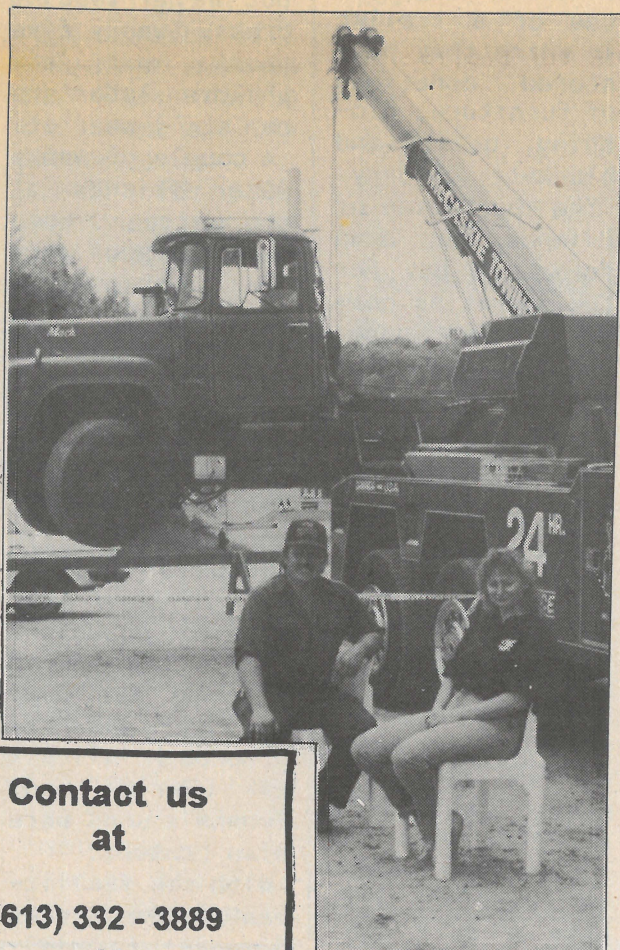
