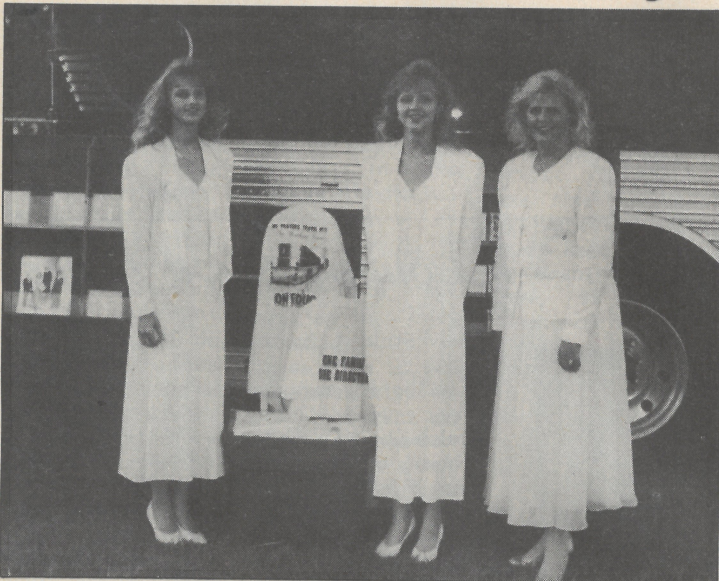


Dungannon Fun Day
