Mr. Johnston lives and works in Scarborough during the week, and from his week-end home in Wilberfoorce (with a partner) is building a recycling business. He is offering recycling to townships - at no cost to the municipality.


He already had Monmouth and Cardiff Townships committed.

Now Bicroft is committed as well. Queensway Recyc-ling will place 4 large receptacles in the municipal waste disposal sites. These, with instructions, are: 1) PLASTICS - any plastic, hard or soft.

2) CANS - aluminum pop cans; food tins (labels off, and - yes - food washed out); even
