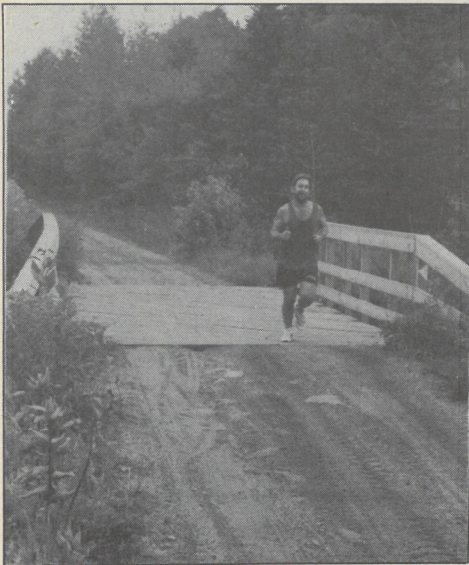


Terry Fox Run

Organizers were delighted. This year's Terry Fox Run in Bancroft, held on Sunday, September 17, was in every way the most successful yet.

A total of 53 people participated: some bicycling, some running, and some walking the 10 kilometres.

These raised around \$3,000 for the Terry Fox Run for Cancer Research. This compares with last year's record of \$2,121.50.

The Terry Fox Run this year was again organized by Sonya Emond, with great assistance from Ron Emond, and Dwayne and Renee Nicholson.

Participants gathered at the Bancroft Railway Station at 12:30 noon on Sunday. The run officially started at 1:00 p.m.

The route this year led south al-

ong the Hastings Heritage Trail to a turn-around near Jan Woodlands. The Railway Station was midway point. Participants continued north another 2 1/2 kilometres, to the Airport. There they turned around, finishing back at the railway station.

Christine and Clive Emery assisted at the south turn-around and at the station.

The Subway Restaurant donated juice and a free Sub for every participant. Quaker Oats donated a package of Harvest Crunch to all participants.

First back was bicyclist Brad McWhirter, in 38:41, with bicyclist Matthew Goulah close behind.

First runner back was Chris Snell, in 54:33, with Terry Talbot one minute later.
