Today I want to share with you a tried and true recipe that I'm sure half of General Motors is eating daily: Butter Tart Squares.

They're so simple you won't believe it!

The story that comes with this recipe was a "near death threat" from one of the women at my husband's work. This woman had a slice one day, asked for the recipe the next, and was amazed at how simple they were to make (and eat). She then proceeded to make not just one - not two - but three pans of these simple yummys, and ate them all on ONE weekend!

Steve is asking me NOT to send recipes like this to his work ever again!

BUTTER TART SQUARES (to die for)

1 cup of margarine (Don't use butter - it burns)

2 cups of flour

1/4 cup of icing sugar

Mix and press onto the bottom and slightly up the sides of an ungreased 9 x 13 pan.

2 cups brown sugar

1/2 cup melted margarine (not butter)

4 beaten eggs

2 tbsp vinegar

2 tsp vanilla

Mix and pour over base.

Optional to add

1 cup raisins (soften in hot water first - drain & dry)

1 cup pecans (yummie)

or 1 cup feather strip coconut.

Sprinkle any or all 3 over top of liquid.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, if you like them gooey - or 40 minutes to slice neatly.

Be sure to wait several minutes because they will burn a child's (or adult's) mouth. I know it will be hard to keep them waiting; but it's for their own good.

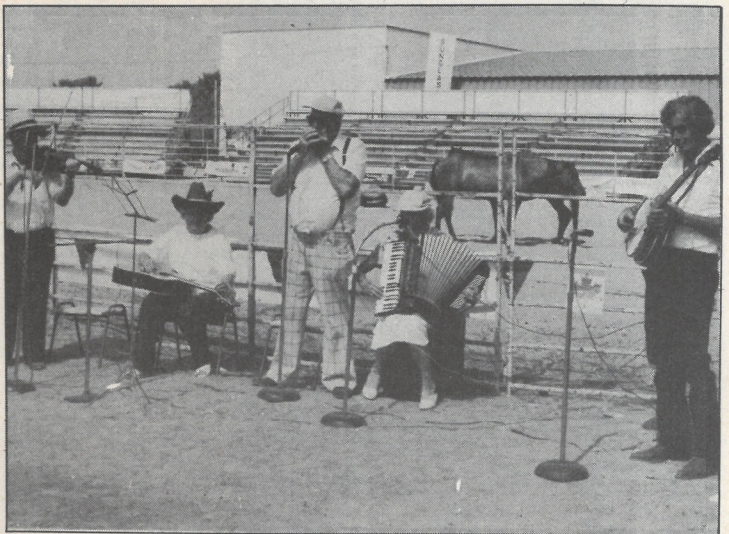

Grace Lake. Lake stewardship involves monitoring water quality.

Gray will be contacting government ministries to find out such things as how to take samples and where to get them tested.

The executive would like to do a survey of septic systems like the one done on Paudash Lake. Of the 48 septic systems surveyed there, 25 were acceptable, 11 needed upgrading and 12 needed replacing.

There are 44 paid up members of the Grace/Dark Lake Property Owners' Association. The Membership fee is \$15.

A printed list was supplied which gave details for a proposed Annual Regatta and Games

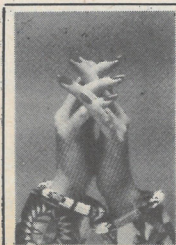

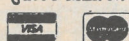
