"RECKLESS FAITH"

The Chapel of Joy Bible Camp, near Bancroft, was a lively place on Friday and Saturday nights, August 25 and 26.

This writer was amused to see the audience reaction. Many teen-agers were at the front of the chapel, swaying or jumping, with hands raised high in the air - like an especially emotional altar call.

Others were sitting quietly in seats in the Chapel, like Presbyterians, listening to the music.

The music was by an Alberta Christian Rock Band, Reckless Faith. Band members are Randy Bailer, Stacey Drefs, Rob Priestley, and Terry Grant.

The band had been brought by Tim Coles, of Havelock, who also works with Kawartha Youth for Christ, planning concerts, sports tournaments, and

youth rallies.

The Christian rock band concert is an annual event at Joy Bible Camp. "I'm working on looking for a band right now," for late August, 1996. The concerts would be open to the public, likely at \$10 per ticket. Inquiries could be directed to Joy Bible Camp, at 613-332-3696.

"Turn your eyes upon Jesus," the band sang, but not with the melody known to this writer.

Many people, Randy Bailer noted, had turned their eyes upon Kirk Cobaine, and had taken their own lives when he took his. "These people [rock musicians] are not gods," he pleaded. "Do not pattern your life on them."

"This concert is designed for kids," Tim Coles explained. It consciously gives the young people a famous rock band experience in a Christian setting.

It is planned at the end of the Junior Teen camp and beginning of Teen camp at Joy Bible Camp.

"In a secular concert [they] would be beating each other up," Tim Coles added. These young people had been warned, "It's fun to jump around. It's no fun to get hurt."

At one point between songs, Randy Bailer told of the band's commitment to World Vision Canada. Literature from this world relief organization was on the table.

One tape and CD of Reckless Faith was also on sale. The group is working on their second tape, for release soon. "The lyrics are much more clear on the tape," Tim Coles added. There would be less background noise.

Music was very loud at Joy Camp, and the musicians very energetic. The audience was energetic and appreciative as well.
