

they stand—number of the lots and concessions—the names of the townships and counties in which said lands are situated—and a statement of the amount remaining unpaid on each individual lot, and how long in arrears.

Mr. Boyd—Inquiry of Ministers as to the agency it proposes to employ (in addition to the Homestead Law), with the view of directing immigration into this Province.

Mr. Boyd—Address for a return of the total sales of Crown, School, and Clergy lands, from the 1st July, 1866, to 1st July, 1867; the necessary expenses of the Department in making and completing said sales, and a statement of the revenue arising from the sales so made.

Mr. Boyd—Address for a return showing the date at which the sale of mineral lands was suspended by the Government; the names of all parties, if any, who had previously made application for the purchase of a portion of said lands; the quantity of land applied for by each, and if applicants had complied with an order in Council passed and approved by His Excellency the Governor-General, bearing date the 13th of July, 1866.

Mr. Boyd—Address for a return of gross revenue derived from the collection of timber dues in the Province of Ontario, from the 1st July, 1866, to the 1st July, 1867, and the expenses of collecting the same.

Mr. Boyd—Inquiry of Ministers if the members of this Legislature are to be supplied with copies of the *Canada Gazette*. Also, with copies of the Act of Confederation: Also, with lists of the parties who voted for them, to be prepared by the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery.

Mr. Boyd—Inquiry of Ministers if they intend to bring to sale, by public auction or otherwise, the balance of public lands in townships, the largest portion of which have been already either settled or sold.

Mr. Hays—Address for a return showing the numbers and names of Municipalities in Ontario which borrowed from the Municipal Loan Fund, the amount each borrowed, the amount each paid, the amount each is in default, and the total amount owing at present by such municipalities.

Mr. Hays—Address for a return showing the number of lots unsold in the Government Townships of North Huron, with numbers and concessions; also, showing the quantity sold in said townships in which the time for payment has expired, with number of lots, concessions, and names of party or parties to whom sold.

Mr. S. McCall—Inquiry of Ministers if it is their intention to continue to defray, out of Provincial funds, the expenses connected with the criminal administration of justice in the several cities and counties of Ontario.

Mr. S. McCall—Address for a return of Crown Lands sold on Long Point (Lake Erie), showing the name or names of each purchaser, with the quantity of land, price per acre, amount paid, amount remaining unpaid, the quantity patented, name of patentees, and if any reservation for landing purposes was made; and if so, to what extent, on the shores of Long Point Bay and Lake Erie.

Mr. Oliver—Bill to protect Butter and Cheese Manufacturers in this Province.

Mr. Carnegie—Bill to repeal the Municipal Act of Upper Canada, in so far as it authorizes County Councils to pass by-laws for borrowing money, without such by-laws being sanctioned by a vote of the ratepayers.

Mr. Carnegie—Inquiry of Ministers whether the Government of Ontario intend to carry out an arrangement entered into between the Government of the late Province of Canada and County and Town Councils of Peterboro and the Canadian Land and Emigration Company, for the construction of a road from Buck Horse to the township of Harvey, to Halliburton, in the township of Dysart, and if so, when the work will be proceeded with.

Mr. McKellar—Bill to extend the Erie and Niagara Railway.

Sir Henry Smith—Bill for the protection of game in the Province of Ontario.

Hon. Mr. McMurrich—Address for a return showing the number of days of each of the Courts of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery, and the Court of Assizes and Nisi Prius of the County of York, and for the City of Toronto, respectively, sat during the years 1866 and 1867—the number of civil cases entered for trial at each of said sittings of said courts respectively—the number of criminals tried at each sitting of said courts—the amount paid by the county and city respectively for jury service at each of the said sittings over and above amount received

from Government for payment of jury expenses connected with Fenians or other Crown cases entered for trial at the County Court for the county and city respectively at each sitting during the said years, with the amount paid by the county and city for jury services respectively, exclusive of Crown grants—the number of cases entered for trial within the same period, at each sitting of said superior and inferior courts, in which neither plaintiff nor defendant resided in the county where the case was entered.

Mr. Trow—Inquiry of Ministers whether the Government of Ontario are prepared to aid municipal corporations in the erection or repairs of county gaols, and in what proportion to the actual expenditure.

Mr. Trow—Inquiry of Ministers whether any timber licenses have been issued to any person or persons in the township of Elms, county of Perth, under the Government of

Ontario, or any former Government of this Province, and if any, to what extent, and the revenue derived therefrom.

Hon. Mr. Richards—On Monday next, certain resolutions respecting free grants of land to actual settlers.

Mr. Boyd—That all petitions praying amendments to the Act imposing a tax on dogs, with such Bills as may be introduced to this House on the same subject, be referred to the special committee on the Municipal and Assessments Act; also, the "Thistle Act"—said committee to send for persons and papers, and to report by Bill.

Hon. Attorney-General McDonald—Bill to amend the Common Law Procedure Act in respect to the granting of certificates of costs.

Mr. Evans—That a special committee be appointed to inquire into and report on the propriety of paying Government Company officials by salary instead of by fees, and in case that be found impracticable, that the tariff of fees be so altered as to allow only a fair remuneration for the services rendered, with power to send for persons and papers.

Mr. Ferguson—Bill to legalize a certain by-law and certain debentures of the County of Simcoe.

Mr. Coyle—Bill to amend the Division Courts Act of Upper Canada.
