PRIVATE BILLS.

Sir HENRY SMITH presented a report from the Private Bills Committee, recommending that the quorum be reduced to pine members. He moved that the said report be coucurred in. Carried.

FIRST READINGS.

Sir HENRY SMITH introduced a Bill to incorporate the Outario College at Picton. He remladed the house that, nader the rules of the House of Commons, which were now in force here, the Bill would now go as a matter of course to the Private Bille Com mittee. He might mention also that he thought the fee formerly required for Private Bills, \$100, was exocasive. This had included the expense of printing in both languages, which was no longer necessary. He shought \$50 or \$60 would be suffi slent.

Hon. J. S. McDONALD said he would take early measures for having rules adopted for the guidance of this house.

Hon, Mr. WOOD introduced a Bill to iscorporate the Grand Lodge of Ontario of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and the subordinate branches under its jurisdiotion.

Mr. McKELLAR introduced a Bill intituled "The Erie and Niagara Ballway Extension Act."

Hon, Mr. WOOD introduced a Bill to amend the Act incorporating the Wellington Grey and Bruce Rallway Company.

Mr. WILLIAMS (Durham) introduced a Bill to amend an Act of the Legislature of Canada, to vest certain real estate of the late Mr. Roche in the hands of trustees.

Mr. WILLIAMS (Durham) introduced a Bill to vest certain real estate in the rector and churchwardens of St. John of Port Hope, and to give authority to raise money on the security of the same, for the building of a new church.

BUTTER AND CHEESE.

Mr. OLIVER asked leave to introduce a Bill to protect butter and cheese manufacturers.
