EXEMPTIONS FROM TAXATION.

Mr. BLAKE moved: That this House ill, on Thursday next, resolve itself into a Cemmittee of the Whole House to consider the following resolutions:-

Resolved-1. That justice requires that every subject should contribute in due proortion to his means to the expenses of that Manicipal Government of which he receives the benefit.

That the Assessment Act should be mended by striking out the exemptions from agation therein contained in favour of cer-

tain classes of subjects.
