

that the Government had declared that the education measure of last session was not a political one; and that some of their own supporters had opposed it. He should also have known that the Chief Superintendent had mixed himself up with politics in 1867. (Hear, hear.)

The item of \$4,000 additional for superannuated teachers was passed.

On item of legislation,

Mr. CAMERON observed that he regretted that the salary of the Sergeant-at-Arms had not been increased.

Mr. DEACON was of opinion that there was a general feeling in the House that the mileage allowances should be increased, in view of the fact that members had to go home for the Christmas holidays.

Mr. MACKENZIE said he had spoken to his colleagues with regard to the remark of the leader of the Opposition respecting increasing the salary of the Sergeant-at-Arms, and believing the feeling of the House generally to be in favour of the suggestion of that hon. gentleman, they had agreed to consider the propriety of increasing his salary by not more than \$200.

The other items of the supplementary estimates were adopted, and the Committee rose and reported.

WAYS AND MEANS.

The House then went into Committee of Ways and Means, and adopted a motion by Mr. Mackenzie, granting \$2,392,072 as a supply to Her Majesty. The Committee then rose and reported.

Mr. MACKENZIE introduced the Supply Bill. Second reading on Monday.

The House then adjourned at 3:50.

Hon. Mr. Cameron—That on the motion for the third reading of Bill No. 30, intituled "An Act to render Members of the House of Commons of Canada ineligible as Members of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario," he will move that the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that the same be referred back to a Committee of the whole House, with instructions to amend the same by striking out all the words in the first clause down to the word "and," in the ninth line, and inserting instead the following:—"Any member of the Legislative Assembly, who shall hereafter be elected with his own consent a member of the House of Commons of Canada, shall hereby vacate his seat in the Legislative Assembly, and he shall become and be ineligible of voting or sitting in the said Assembly."

Also—That the second clause be amended by striking out the words "In case," and inserting, in lieu thereof, the following:—"No member of the House of Commons of Canada shall be eligible to be elected a member of the Legislative Assembly and --"
