Mr. Baxter—On Friday next—Address for copies of all Orders in Council since January 1st, 1871, relating to the Free Grant Territory; also, the number of lots located and number of settlers who have settled in the several townships of said territory.

Hon. Mr. Crooks—On Friday next—Bill intituled “An Act to facilitate the adjustment of disputes between masters and workmen.”

Also—On Friday next—Bill intituled “An Act to establish a School of Practical Science”

Mr. McDonald—On Thursday next—Address for copies of all Orders in Council and correspondence in reference to the insurance with the Isolated Risk Insurance Company or any other insurance company of any of the public buildings in this Province.

Also—On Thursday next, Enquiry of Ministers, whether they intend to recommend the establishment of a hospital for incurables.

Mr. Deacon—On Friday next, Bill to amend chapter 85 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, intituled “An Act respecting the conveyance of real estate by Married Women,” and to declare valid (under certain circumstances) conveyances informally executed.

Mr. Prince—On Friday next, That it is desirable that the management of the fisheries of Ontario be transferred to that Province, and that such steps shall be taken as shall induce that result.

Mr. Williams (Durham)—On Friday next, Bill, “An Act to amend section (2) of the Grammar School Act of 1865.”
