Mr. Hamilton—From the School Board of L'Orignal, for amendments to the School Act.

Mr. Smith—From the Township Council of Adelaide, asking for attachment to Middlesex, for registration purposes.

Also—From Thomas Burk, John Waltham, Leslie Lindsay, and others, for the division of the County of Middlesex.

Mr. Coyne—From the Village Council of Streetsville, for certain amendments to the Registry Act.

Mr. Wood (Brant)—From Ephraim Cook and others, of Norwich, for an Act to amend the Act Incorporating the Norfolk Railway.

Hon. Mr. Crooks—From J. O. Wagner, and also from J. Thompson and others, for an Act to establish liens in favour of mechanics.
