Mr. Lauder—On Thursday next—Address for a return of all land sold or leased by the Government between the first day of December, 1871, and the present time, to members of this House, or to any firm or company in which any member of this House was a partner, including mineral locations and licenses to cut timber on the lands of the Crown, and also all renewals of such licenses.

Mr. Scott (Grey)—On Thursday next—A Bill entitled “An Act to enable Township Councils to pass by-laws providing for the breaking of a double track on roads during deep snow.”
