CREDIC VALLEY RAILWAY.

On the order for the third reading of the Bill respecting the Credit Valley Rallway Lompany.

Mr. MASSIE opposed the Bill, it being clear to him thet its provisions ignored the represes tadves of the people. It was right and proper that municipal governments should have a votes to all things effecting their interests He moved to amentment,

reconded by Mr. PAX "ON, " That the Blu be not now read a third time, but that it be meferred book to a Committee of the whole House to be amended by adding after the words 'additional atd' in line 22 of section 22, 'in which case it shall be in the discresion of the council of the municipality to submit a by-law to the vote of the qualified electors, and except as herein provided,"

Mr. BELL of jected to the amendment as defeating the object of the Bill, and als) as ont of order.

The SPEAKER, after some discussion. raled that the motion was out of order, and be third reading was declaried carried.

THE PROPLE'S GAS COMPANY.

On the House res lving itself into Committee of the Whote on the Bill to incorparate the People's Gas Compary,

Mr. BELL moved that the words inserted In the 28 b clause by the Private Bills Committee be struck out. He argued that the City Council was sufficiently protected win. cus this provision

Mr. Cameron thought that this pro whilen, which required the consent of the City Connoil before the Campany could break up the street, or any set of streets was very reasonable. He therefore opposed the amendment

Mr. MOW AT could not see the propriety of giving the City Council power to veto the action of the Legislature. It seemed to him shat the city was spiliolenily protected by the provision enacting that the consent of the engineer must be obsained before any sirees oculd be opener'.

Mr. CAMERON atrongly argued to favour of the City Connoil having the right to say whether the stress should be opened or not, I sat body being to pratible to the obligant for the state and repairs of the streets.

After further francon, the amendment was carried by 24 to 15.

The Committee rose, and reported the Bill with amendments.

LIQUOR LICENSES.

The amendments made to Committee on the Bul to smend the Asi respecting the sale of spirituous liquors were concurred in.

ENCOURAGEMENT OF AGRICUL. TURE, &

The House went into Comultico on the Bill for the encouragement of agriculture, Hortloulture, Arie, and Manufactures, and gasaed several amendmenta thereto.

After recess.

The House again went into Committee on the Bill for the Ecouragement of Agriculture and Arts, and further amended the Bill. The Commissee rose and reported the Bill ac smerded.

THE EDUCATION ACT.

The House went into Committee on the Bill to amend the several Acts respecting the Education Dagartment, Pabilo and High Schools, and the University of Toronto.

Mr. CROOKS explained that he should coly move the adoption of those clauses to which no smend nems were proposed. In reference to the other clauses, he had recelv. ed so meny sugges tons that he wished time for their punelderstion.
