THE HAMILTON COURT HOUSE.

The county of Wentworth and the city of Hamilton had determined to build a new Court-House, the oity agreeing to pay 60 por cent of the cost and the Council 40 per cent. Ha saked the House to suspend its rule and sliow a measure to be introduced for legalizing the agreement entered into by the sounty and the city. He moved the first reading of the Bill.

The Bill was read the first time. THE EDUCATION BILL.

On the metion of Mr. CROOKs, the House sgale went into Committee on the Bill to smerd the several Acts respecting the Educasion Department, Public and High Schools, and the University of Toronto.
